

## GRU and KGB Use of Satellite Communications

Evidence indicates that in 1965 the GRU had planned and was developing satellites for communications with intelligence agents abroad. An entire institute was then involved in designing a radio set adaptable to satellite use. The satellite/radio project reportedly was dropped in 1968, but apparently was later revived. The Soviets reportedly felt that, when functional, it would provide world-wide coverage of GRU agent communications.

The KGB reportedly collaborated in the late 1960s with the GRU and various technical agencies in developing an agent-related space communications system. While we are not aware that the KGB has used satellites to relay agent-related data, there is evidence that
