#### How to Align an ERA Transfer Request and NA-14130

The NA-14130 Classified Records Transfer Checklist is an essential part of the classified permanent records accessioning process. The information you share on the Checklist helps NARA to understand the declassification review steps your agency has taken.

The NA-14130 also helps NARA understand what protections your classified permanent records need as they are accessioned into the Archives and maintained in NARA's holdings.

An NA-14130 documenting the results of declassification review (or your agency's comparable form containing the same information) must be completed and attached to each ERA Transfer Request (TR) for classified and declassified permanent records.

By taking the time to compare and align the NA-14130 and ERA TR for each transfer, you are helping your agency and NARA work together to protect, move, and accession the records properly and safely.

#### **Glossary**

**Accessioning** – The process through which agency records become part of the holdings of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA). More information about accessioning at NARA can be found on the <u>Accessioning Guidance</u> page on archives.gov.

**Analog records** – Records in physical formats such as paper, microfilm, x-ray films, and photographic prints.

**Equities** – Each piece of classified information belongs to the agency that originally classified it. Agencies can only declassify information that belongs to them - their "equities." Agencies cannot declassify equities that belong to other agencies.

**Executive Order 12958** – Executive Order 12958, Classified National Security Information, was signed by President Clinton in 1995. The order prescribes a uniform system for classifying, safeguarding, and declassifying national security information.

<u>Executive Order 13526</u> – Executive Order 13526, Classified National Security Information, was signed by President Obama in 2009. The order prescribes a uniform system for classifying, safeguarding, and declassifying national security information, including information relating to defense against transnational terrorism.

**Exclusions** – A special type of classified nuclear information which belongs to the Department of Energy. These are excluded from the Executive order because they are classified by statute.

**Exempt Documents** – If the agency determines that information belonging to that agency cannot be declassified, then that information is described as "exempt."

**Formerly Restricted Data (FRD)** – Information that is still classified under the Atomic Energy Act, but which has been removed from the RD category because it is related primarily to the military utilization of nuclear weapons. FRD is exempt from Executive Order 12958, including the automatic declassification provisions in section 3.4.

**Historical Record RD Reviewer (HRRD Reviewer)** – An individual trained and certified by DOE to recognize information potentially classified as RD/FRD in records that are subject to the automatic declassification provisions of Executive Order 12958. HRRD Reviewers may not declassify RD/FRD information or documents.

**Kyl-Lott Review** – By law, agencies must either perform and document a page-bypage review for nuclear weapons information or certify that the records are "highly unlikely" to contain nuclear weapons information.

Senators John Kyl and Trent Lott sponsored an amendment to Section 1068 of the FY2000 Defense Authorization Act to require review of records for nuclear weapons information under Department of Energy (DOE) guidelines, resulting in what is now known as the "Kyl-Lott Amendment."

For specifics, see the <u>Special Historical Records Review Plan</u> (Supplement) (Public Laws 105-261 and 106-65).

**National Declassification Center (NDC)** – The National Declassification Center, located at the National Archives College Park Maryland facility, was established in accordance with Executive Order 13526. The purpose of the Center is to streamline declassification processes, facilitate quality-assurance measures, and implement standardized training regarding the declassification of records determined to have permanent historical value. The Center's mission is to advance the declassification and public release of historically valuable permanent records while maintaining national security.

**Referrals** – Classified information that belongs to a different agency. Agencies cannot declassify equities that belong to other agencies, so if they are present in the transfer, the transfer is still classified. If no referrals or exclusions are present, the transfer does not contain classified information belonging to other agencies. See also *Equities*.

**Restricted Data (RD)** – Information classified under the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended, concerning (1) the design, manufacture, or utilization of nuclear weapons; (2) the production of special nuclear material, e.g., enriched uranium or plutonium; or (3) the use of special nuclear material in the production of energy. RD is exempt from Executive Order 12958, including the automatic declassification provisions in section 3.4. See also *Executive Order 13526*.

**Special Access Program (SAP)** – Special Access Program (SAP) material needs to be escorted by staff that have been read into the program. NARA can and does accept SAP records – NARA NDC staff must be read into the program, first.

Special Historical Records Review Plan (Supplement, Public Laws 105-261 and 106-65) – The Special Historical Records Review Plan was developed by the Department of Energy in response to the Kyl-Lott amendment to the Defense Authorization Act of 2000. The plan outlines steps agencies must take to ensure no Restricted Data (RD) or Formerly Restricted Data (FRD) is present in records being transferred to NARA. This review is frequently referred to as a Kyl-Lott Review.

The purpose of this plan is to prevent the inadvertent release of records containing Restricted Data (RD) and Formerly Restricted Data (FRD) during the declassification of records under Section 3.4 of Executive Order 12958, "Classified National Security Information."

**Tabbed** – Agencies use the Standard Form 715, Government Declassification Review Tab, to tab and identify any Federal record requiring referral.

**Textual records** – Records consisting primarily of written words on paper or other analog media.

**Washington National Records Center (WNRC)** - The NARA Federal Records Center which stores classified permanent records on behalf of agencies and NARA.
