1. (C) (SECRET) Reference is made to message, this Headquarters, file F-60317, dated 26 October 1957, subject: Georgi KRUG, and letter, your Region, dated 1 November 1957, file FR-021685, subject: Georgi KRUG.

2. (C) (SECRET) In the debriefing of KRUG, he stated that he had been orientated by Frau TELEGIN, correct name Grigorii KONDRASCHOW, in Moscow during October 1956. KONDRASCHOW furnished information to KRUG concerning Olga PETROWSKY and Tatjana KONDRASCHOW. In addition, KRUG was furnished information concerning SUBJECT who was described as an employee of the NIS Radio Station and sub-tenant of PETROWSKY. At the end of October 1956 - early November 1956, KRUG went to Frankfurt and, among other missions, was directed to attempt to locate TURZEV and verify his residence with Frau PETROWSKY. KRUG stated he looked up the telephone number of PETROWSKY in the telephone book (previously checked and verified by your Region) and was informed by a female voice that TURZEV was on a trip at the time and would not be back until the following week. KRUG claims no further effort was ever made by him concerning TURZEV.

(U) (CONFIDENTIAL) It is desired that you contact SUBJECT and under the suggested pretext that Tatania KONDRA SCHOW had made some vague mention of Soviet attempts to contact her after the redefaction of her husband, U.S. authorities were interested in determining whether any further efforts had been made in this direction and if Tatania KONDRA SCHOW had furnished full details to U.S. authorities about the scope and extent of Soviet interest in her and her husband. Also, it would appear likely that the Soviets must have manifested some interest in TURZEV. With this as a suggested basis for approach, it is desired that TURZEV be interviewed in detail to ascertain exactly when the visit of "VALENTIN" (subsequently identified by the FBI as PERMINOV and probably not known to SUBJECT as PERMINOV) took place. Exact description should be obtained of the other personality who accompanied "VALENTIN" to the residence of KONDRA SCHOW. Details of the discussion between PERMINOV and KONDRA SCHOW are desired. TURZEV should be questioned as to whether any further contact was ever made to KONDRA SCHOW by any other members of the Soviet Embassy or other persons. He should be specifically questioned as to whether he had any knowledge of any questionable visitors or messages to Tatania KONDRA SCHOW during the fall of 1956. An attempt should be made to ascertain if TURZEV was involved in any business trips away from the Frankfurt area during the first week of November 1956. Care should be taken to hide knowledge of the contents of the inclosed Frankfurt police report from TURZEV. If possible, TURZEV should be requested to provide a signed statement concerning his knowledge of both KONDRA SCHOW and Mrs. PETROWSKY.

SUBJNOT: Vladimir TURZEV (U)

5. (CONFIDENTIAL) It is to be noted that in previous review of Tatania KONDRAKOV's visa screening file she made no mention of any visit to her by members of the Soviet Embassy in Bonn, although she had revealed details of efforts made by her former husband to contact her. Upon completion of your interview of TURZEV, the material will be furnished COMINT authorities as a basis for further questioning of KONDRAKOV.

6. (CONFIDENTIAL) Information gained from the [REDACTED] who queried the DAB element of CIA concerning SUBJECT discloses that TURZEV is no longer employed by KGB.

7. (SECRET) The statements of KHUG are not fully believed. However, it is possible that KHUG's attempts to verify the residence of TURZEV may have been a prelude to the later contact made by PERMINOV in January 1957.

8. (UNCLASSIFIED) It is desired that the results of your interview of TURZEV be furnished as quickly as possible.
