1. Reference A does not give sufficient detail to make a very realistic appraisal at this time of the damage to our operations from the arrest of AMRE-1. ²⁴

2. According to AMRE-1, the head principal agent of our stay-behind nets in Cuba, AMRE-1 was kept fully informed of everything concerning operations and reporting. He also knew of the AMRE-1 agent net and how contact can be made with the agents. He was kept fully cognizant of all incoming and outgoing radio messages and reports.
