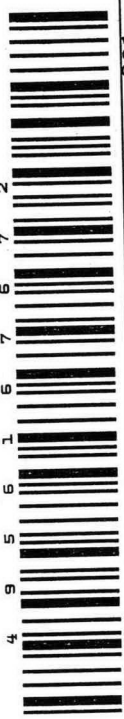

Heading Off an Indictment

"Another opening, another show" would be an appropriate theme song for many criminal defense lawyers. Most defense counsel thrive on trial work; they revel in the art and drama of the courtroom.

No doubt, as far as professional experiences go, there are few things as exhilarating as a crisp cross-examination or a scintillating summation before a packed courtroom in a criminal jury trial. During a break at a recent criminal trial in New Orleans, an experienced practitioner from Chicago told me: "Cross-examination is my life."

The courtroom also seems to furnish defense attorneys with a kind of bonding experience. In my observation, criminal lawyers uniquely appreciate, if not exult in, the successes of their comrades-at-arms (albeit, perhaps, with varying degrees of wistful jealousy). Certainly, the courtroom is the primary source of our war stories and folklore. In fact, if autobiographies like *Gunning for Justice* and *My Life in Court* are any gauge of the defense bar's collective psyche, trials are the only aspect of criminal defense work worth talking about.

I too enjoy the thrill of trial work. Often, though, defense counsel's first duty and primary task is to avoid trial. Particularly in the area of white collar defense work, the indictment of your client is a disaster, even if he is later acquitted. Politicians, executives, licensed professionals, fiduciaries, and others simply cannot withstand the opprobrium of indictment, much less the scrutiny, tension, and stress that they and their families must endure during a public criminal trial.

Ask former automobile magnate John DeLorean, former national security advisor Thomas Reed, or former Arthur Andersen partner Warren Essner whether acquittal at trial restored their careers. I do not denigrate the skill of the trial lawyers who represented them; to the contrary, their results speak for themselves. Nor do I suggest that the lawyers in those cases did not ably attempt to head off the indictment at the pass. But the fact remains that a publicized indictment and trial almost inevitably sully a person's reputation and close off career paths, despite a jury's verdict of not guilty.

So the skillful criminal lawyer's repertoire necessarily includes the art of disposing of criminal matters before indict-

ment and trial. This less publicized role of defense counsel involves a variety of strategies and techniques quite different from courtroom skills. If you are going to represent defendants in criminal cases, you should be familiar with the techniques that have been used to convince prosecutors not to indict.

First, some words of caution: Sometimes the prosecutor will indict regardless of the defense lawyer's skills. And each case is unique, requiring careful evaluation of all the facts and circumstances and difficult judgment calls that are subject to second-guessing. Even the same case may require different approaches at different times.

Equally important, different lawyers would handle the same case in very different ways, and each approach may well be sound. During my days as a federal prosecutor, I was repeatedly impressed by the effectiveness of strikingly dissimilar approaches taken by different defense counsel in the same white collar case. In short, the strategies discussed in this article are neither exhaustive nor fail-safe.

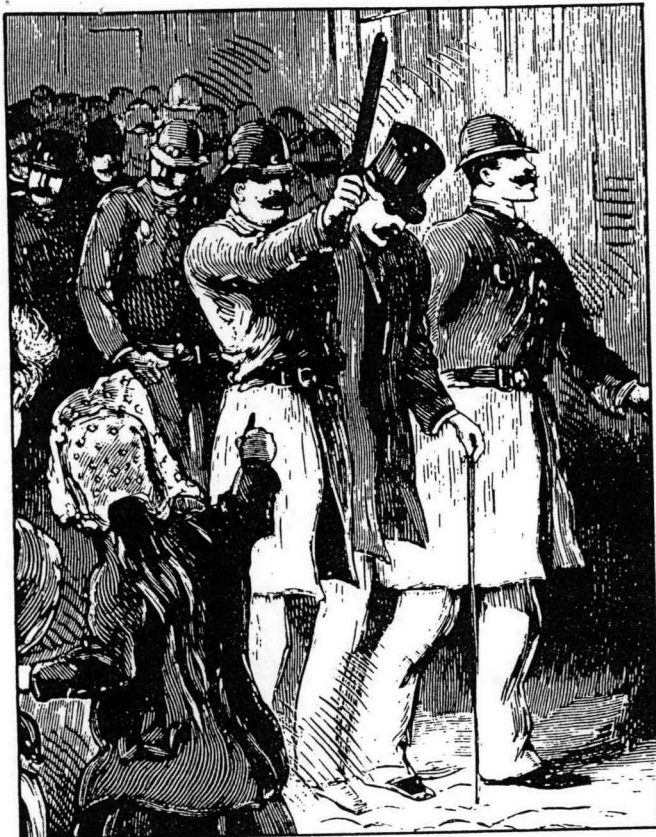
The sooner a lawyer gets started, the better. Unfortunately, the timing is usually beyond his control. Whenever you are retained, though, the first step should be an in-depth investigation of your client's situation.

Ordinarily, the investigation begins with *thorough debriefings* of the client. Although some defense counsel believe that, at least in some cases, it is better not to know the full story from the client, the attorney is usually best prepared to serve his client if he knows all the facts, good and bad.

Despite lawyers' best efforts to explain that to their clients, and despite the attorney-client privilege, clients are often reluctant to confide in their lawyers. Perhaps because of embarrassment, fear, or mistrust, most clients tend initially to sugar-coat or even dissemble the events under investigation. A client may also labor under the misapprehension that the lawyer will not work as hard if he thinks his client is less than angelic.

Through hard work and patience, these barriers can usually be overcome. It is necessary to remind a client often about the attorney-client privilege and to resort to homilies like, "A doctor cannot treat a patient properly if the patient won't tell him the symptoms." Or, as a partner of mine tells his clients, "You can tell me now, when I can help you, or you will tell me later, when I may not be able to help you." With enough encourage-

ment, most clients will tell you most of the facts. Almost always this process takes time and persistence.

At the same time, counsel should consider what other sources of information are available. If a case involves documents, the attorney should review them carefully. That is necessary for trial anyway, and the earlier you digest the "hard" evidence, the better informed your early and often critical decisions will be. You may also need to hire an expert, like an accountant, to help evaluate the documents. To preserve the privilege, it is essential that the lawyer and not the client retain the expert. See *United States v. Kovel*, 296 F.2d 918, 922 (2d Cir. 1961).

In some cases, you may also be able to interview other witnesses. But be careful not to disclose the fact of the government's investigation to witnesses who are not already aware of it. As the municipal corruption investigations in New York have vividly demonstrated, the publicity surrounding an investigation can be as ruinous to your client's reputation (and health) as an indictment or conviction. If the fact of the investigation is not already public, you may decide to skip certain interviews altogether, rather than risk potentially disastrous leaks to the press. In addition, since defense counsel's interviews are discoverable, consider whether an interview would risk tipping your hand for the prosecutor to see.

If you decide to conduct interviews — for example, with your client's key employees or associates who are already aware of the investigation, or with potential alibi or other defense witnesses — bring someone with you, such as a paralegal or a private investigator. In some cases, you may decide not to participate at all, and instead rely entirely on a trusted investigator.

You may wish to avoid a face-to-face interview if the defense of the case rests on demonstrating that the witness is lying or that he despises your client. In still other cases, only the law-

yer will be able to interview the witness, such as the chief executive officer of a major company.

Generally, it is better to conduct interviews without your client. Occasionally, though, a witness, such as a spouse, may refuse to talk to you in the absence of your client. If the witness is inclined to help your client, say that, to best serve your client's interests, you need to understand exactly what happened. It is also good practice, if the witness is a corporate officer or employee, to tell him that you represent your particular client and not the witness.

Other lawyers in the same case may also be a source of information. Defense counsel's willingness to share facts depends on their professional relationship as well as their clients' relationship. Generally, the lawyers should communicate, rather than allowing their clients to talk about the case.

Discussions among counsel are ordinarily covered by the joint-defense and work-product privileges, while conversations among clients are not privileged. To avoid any incriminating statements or claims of obstruction, instruct the client not to discuss the investigation with anyone.

Even counsel for witnesses adverse to your client may be willing to talk to you. Sure, a lawyer for a hostile witness is not going to give you devastating impeachment material. But most witnesses are reluctant to testify, and the other lawyer may decide to give you a summary of the witness's testimony to encourage your client to plead guilty. Also, even if a witness's testimony would hurt your client, the witness may still be sympathetic enough to let you interview him or to provide information through his counsel.

The prosecutor, too, may provide important information. Most prosecutors will at least disclose the general nature of the investigation and tell you whether your client is a subject or a target. If the government lawyers are confident of their case, they may tell you much more than that before they indict.

Also, when the government wants a quick guilty plea or your client's cooperation, you can often get the prosecutor to talk. When I was on the other side of the fence, I regularly invited defense counsel to review documentary evidence or to listen to tape recordings early in the investigation. That kind of disclosure depends largely on the chemistry between the lawyers. So, while keeping in mind that the prosecutor is not your client's friend, it may be important to tone down the adversarial nature of your initial dealings with him.

As you seek information from the government, you begin to form impressions of the prosecutor and of where the investigation is likely to go. Is the government intent on making a case, and, if so, against whom? Is your client a major target or a peripheral figure? At what stage is the investigation? Will the prosecutor listen to your presentation fairly and with an open mind? Especially if you have not dealt with the particular government lawyer handling the case, it is certainly worth getting your colleagues' views of the person who will largely determine your client's fate.

Armed with as much information as possible about the prosecutor, the investigation, and the client, you must devise the best strategy for avoiding indictment.

If your client is an important target and the violations are serious and obvious, there may be few alternatives. In some cases, there may be no choice but to wait out the investigation in the hope that the prosecutor will be unable to make a case or that, with a change in government personnel or priorities, the case will slip between the cracks. If, as usual, this tactic

fails and the client is about to be indicted, the only options are plea bargaining, limited motion practice, or trial.

In most cases, though, defense counsel should not simply await the indictment. Rather, develop a plan of attack to beat the charges before they are brought. Although this is an uphill battle, it is usually worth fighting.

First consider whether your client is a candidate for immunity. If he played only a minor role in the events under investigation, the government will probably grant immunity. Even if the client's role was significant, sympathetic circumstances

such as old age or poor health may commend the exercise of prosecutorial discretion.

Perhaps even more important to the prosecutor is the impact of your client's potential testimony on the investigation. "Who can your guy give up?" or "Can your guy testify against Mr. X?" are questions frequently heard in the prosecutor's office.

More than once, a prosecutor has granted immunity to a former lover or a longtime subordinate of the main target despite that person's involvement in serious offenses over a long period of time. According to published reports, the key witness against former Undersecretary of Defense and LTV chairman Paul Thayer was his girlfriend, Sandra Ryno. Ms. Ryno was granted immunity despite her participation in an insider trading scheme, her apparent participation in the initial stages of a cover-up before the SEC, and her personal profits from the fraud of more than \$150,000. Thayer was sentenced to four years in prison.

Timing is critical in the immunity game. It is sound courtroom wisdom that the first one in gets the best deal.

The recent municipal corruption scandal in New York City vividly illustrates this point. Ordinarily, a federal prosecutor relishes the opportunity to go after a corrupt lawyer. In the early stages of the New York City investigation, though, the U.S. Attorney's Office granted immunity to a lawyer who had paid cash to one or more city officials, but who was in a position to testify against a powerful politician.

When I was a prosecutor, a lawyer who represented a middle-level conspirator in a securities fraud case came to my office to volunteer a "proffer" — a hypothetical recitation of his client's testimony. After he made a detailed proffer (without names) regarding the fraud, I consulted all relevant agencies to confirm that the government was unaware of the scheme.

Satisfied that serious crimes might otherwise go unpunished, I reluctantly recommended immunity in exchange for cooperation and complete restitution. The very day after the immunity agreement was signed, the victims of the scheme came to my office to report the crime. To this day, the defense counsel in that case reminds me of his good timing whenever we see each other.

Although early requests for immunity are usually more successful, sometimes a prosecutor will be compelled to give

immunity late in an investigation because of lack of evidence or other problems with the case. If, after exhausting all other leads, a prosecutor needs a critical piece of proof or feels uncomfortable with a largely circumstantial case, he may immunize someone he would otherwise indict. Occasionally, even a murderer or a drug dealer is the beneficiary of this circumstance. Although luck may play a part in who gets immunity, a defense lawyer serves his client well by keeping track of the investigation as it unfolds, so that he can go for immunity, if circumstances warrant it, at the most propitious moment.

Of course, before attempting to arrange immunity, a lawyer must consult with his client. Sometimes a client will not want to cooperate — the price tag may be unacceptable — even if immunity is available. Fear, business realities, or loyalties to family or friends may outweigh immediate self-interest.

The lawyer must carefully explain all the consequences of and alternatives to the decision to go for immunity. In particular, it is the defense attorney's obligation to explore with his client any possibility of violent retaliation; the practical impact on the client's life, including loss of livelihood; and the likelihood that the client will be prosecuted, convicted, and sent to jail if he does not cooperate. Ultimately, of course, it is the client's decision whether to seek immunity and to cooperate if immunity is offered.

It is especially important that the client understand that immunity ordinarily results in the disclosure of all criminal problems, not just the facts of the particular violations under investigation. So, if the client has other skeletons in the closet, cooperation may be out of the question, even though his role in the events being investigated was minor.

The Importance of Candor

Emphasize that in talking with the prosecutor your client must be completely candid and accurate, and that any attempts to cover up can only lead to disaster. Partial cooperation will result in damaging admissions and preclude an effective defense. Prosecutors are understandably hard on "cooperators" who fail to tell the whole truth, and judges are notoriously unsympathetic to defendants who blow their immunity agreement by lying to the prosecutor or the grand jury.

If, after full consultation, the client elects to seek immunity, do everything you can to get it for him. Since timing may be critical, a prompt visit to the prosecutor's office is in order.

In almost all cases, the prosecutor will want at least an oral proffer spelling out the testimony your client will give. You should agree to make a proffer only after the prosecutor agrees to treat it as a hypothetical recitation that he will not use directly against your client if you do not get together on an immunity agreement. In my experience, all prosecutors accept such limited-use proffers. But be sure to make your agreement explicit.

Generally, the fewer details that the proffer divulges, the better. If immunity is not granted, too many details could provide the prosecutor with leads that he can follow up without violating the letter of your limited-use agreement. The resulting turn in the investigation could lead the government right back to your client.

Also, a witness's recollection of events often varies upon retelling, and you do not want to be in the position of having to explain discrepancies between your proffer and your client's actual statements to the prosecutor. For similar reasons, written proffers are to be avoided.

But it is equally dangerous to say too little. If the grant of immunity is based on a proffer that omits material facts of your client's involvement in the events under investigation or of his other crimes, the immunity agreement may be voided. Or the prosecutor may insist on a guilty plea to the crimes that were not disclosed. In either event, you will lose your credibility with both the prosecutor's office and your client, and your client will lose much more than credibility.

In some cases, the prosecutor will request a proffer that comes right from the client's mouth. That poses tremendous risks.

With your client present to tell his own story and to answer the prosecutor's questions, the prosecutor learns about your defense case and, if you do not get together on an immunity agreement, he can use what he learns to shape the investigation and to avoid surprises at trial. Your client will also undoubtedly make damaging admissions in the course of the proffer.

By getting the prosecutor to agree in writing to the limited use of the proffer, defense counsel can control some of these risks. Nevertheless, a proffer by the client inevitably locks in his story and divulges leads, wrinkles, and avenues for cross-examination that the prosecutor can often use to demolish the defense case and, with it, your client's future if you do not get the immunity you wanted.

So, if the prosecutor insists that the proffer come directly from your client, carefully weigh the risks against the likelihood of obtaining immunity. Particularly if you suspect that the prosecutor is not acting in good faith or is unlikely to be sympathetic to your client, you should usually decline to bring your client in to make his own proffer. Some defense lawyers flatly refuse to submit their clients for in-person proffers under any circumstance, and most prosecutors will not insist on a direct proffer.

If the prosecutor is willing to grant immunity, the next question is what form of immunity best serves your client's interests. Federal and most state prosecutors can provide either transactional or testimonial immunity.

Transactional immunity offers complete protection against any criminal liability relating to the specified transactions. But transactional immunity covers only the events described in the immunity agreement.

Because transactional immunity is generally governed by contract, it binds only the government authority that enters into the agreement. So a transactional immunity agreement with one federal prosecutor does not preclude the local prosecutor or even a federal prosecutor in another district from indicting your client.

Although the prosecutor granting immunity can usually convince the prosecutor in the other jurisdiction to honor the immunity agreement, it is imprudent to rely on their good relations. Turf battles among law enforcement authorities are neither rare nor gentlemanly. To protect your client, arrange for immunity agreements with each authority investigating the case.

Testimonial or statutory immunity, which in the federal system requires both a court order and approval from the Department of Justice, bars any direct or indirect use of the immunized testimony. See 18 U.S.C. §§ 6001 *et seq.* Technically, though, a prosecutor remains free to indict so long as he can demonstrate that his proof is wholly independent of the immunized testimony. See *Kastigar v. United States*, 406 U.S. 441 (1972). Because "taint" or *Kastigar* hearings are so burdensome and because they require pretrial disclosure of the government's

entire case, as a practical matter testimonial immunity ordinarily precludes prosecution of your client.

Particularly when only one prosecutor's office is investigating or likely to investigate a matter, transactional immunity is generally your best bet. Some clients nonetheless prefer testimonial immunity because they can tell their associates that they did not voluntarily cooperate but did do so only under compulsion of court order. Also, unlike transactional immunity, testimonial immunity is binding on all federal, state, and local prosecutors. But testimonial immunity cannot bind foreign prosecutors. See *Zicarelli v. New Jersey*, 406 U.S. 472 (1972).

Testimonial immunity may also have one other advantage. Experienced defense lawyers know that, despite their repeated admonitions to tell the truth and their client's insistence that they *are* telling the truth, some clients still lie. In the case of transactional immunity, such falsehoods breach the agreement and subject the client to prosecution for all offenses, including the underlying crimes plus perjury.

In contrast, a mendacious witness who testifies pursuant to a grant of testimonial immunity probably cannot be charged with the underlying crimes, although he can be prosecuted for perjury, false statements to a grand jury, and obstruction of justice. This distinction may be small comfort, though, for the client who opts for testimonial immunity and gets caught lying. Under federal law, perjury is punishable by up to five years in jail and a \$10,000 fine.

Suppose immunity is not a viable alternative. Say your client is the prime target of the investigation. Or your client is a highly visible figure, a politician, a lawyer, or chairman of the board. What then?

First, you can resort to familiar damage-control measures: Prepare potential witnesses (keeping in mind that, if they are not your clients, your preparation sessions will be discoverable) or advise them to retain counsel and to have their counsel prepare them; make sure that all witnesses are advised by counsel of their rights, including the right to remain silent; review

all documents before your client produces them and take vigorous good-faith positions on the attorney-client and other applicable privileges; and take steps to limit the scope of any subpoenas served on your client.

A target of an investigation may also go to court to protect his rights. Lawyers have had mixed success recently in challenging grand jury subpoenas *duces tecum* on Fifth Amendment grounds. In rarer circumstances, Fourth Amendment claims of unlawful searches and seizures may be litigated prior to indictment. See *FED. R. CRIM. P. 41*.

Other issues that may be litigated at the pre-indictment stage involve the attorney-client and spousal privileges, grand jury abuses, and violations of the rules governing parallel criminal

and civil investigations. When the investigation concerns foreign banking records or other documents maintained abroad, potential defendants often succeed in invoking bank secrecy and foreign blocking statutes in litigation both here and in foreign countries to bar, limit, or delay production of incriminating records.

If successful, preindictment litigation may result in suppression of evidence or may even derail an investigation. And, whether or not it is successful, litigation at this stage may compel the government to make helpful disclosures about its activities. The government may also decide to abandon certain aspects of the investigation because of the delay and expense involved in litigating complicated issues. Especially if the statute of limitations is about to expire, the prosecution will be unable to await an appellate ruling on a complicated privilege or treaty question.

Balance the Psychological Impact

Against the possibility of winning usually limited victories through preindictment litigation, balance the psychological impact it is likely to have on the prosecutor. When faced with a series of witnesses invoking the Fifth Amendment and fighting document production, he will inevitably conclude that somebody has something to hide. If he already appears to be dead set on putting your client in the slammer, you have little to lose by throwing up every barrier you can get your hands on. But if you still hope to convince the prosecutor that there has been no crime or that whatever technical violation there has been does not warrant criminal sanctions, you cannot simultaneously engage the government in guerilla warfare.

Before you decide which way to play it, consider the non-confrontational alternatives.

At some point in the investigation, many defense lawyers make a pitch to get the prosecutor not to indict. Although anyone who regularly throws strikes in this league is an all-star, the game is very often worth a try. If nothing else, in the course of the dialogue, the prosecutor may reveal the government's theories or its evidence. Also, even if your presentation does not convince the prosecutor to abandon the investigation, you may lay the groundwork for a favorable plea bargain. And, in some cases, prosecutors do change their minds.

The presentation should be orderly and low-key. There is no percentage in yelling at the person in charge of the investigation, and a rambling presentation is as ineffective as a rambling opening or summation. Even if histrionics are your style, save them for the courtroom.

Think through in advance what your pitch should be. What issues are really worth discussing with the prosecutor? What are the investigators' concerns? Why shouldn't the government go forward with its case? Keep in mind that, in the prosecutor's office, the target is presumed guilty until proven innocent, no matter what the judge charges a jury.

It is often effective to let the prosecutor know right off that you have considered his position, that you realize that the government has invested considerable time and effort in the investigation, but that you are confident he will fairly consider what you have to say. Most prosecutors are responsible people with a sense of fair play and some degree of rationality. Many are inexperienced. Appeal to the prosecutor's better instincts, but avoid talking down to him, even if you are 20 years his senior. And be careful not to overstate or overplay your hand. Any

inaccuracies will undermine your credibility with an already skeptical audience.

What you say will, of course, vary from case to case. The most effective presentations generally focus on two or three major points.

Reasons to sympathize with the client, including poor health and old age, are favorite themes — so much so that, during my years as a prosecutor, I began to wonder why every potential defendant has a dying relative and is either old and decrepit or a young, naive victim of some older Svengali. Aside from reacting to such arguments with a certain degree of cynicism, prosecutors often respond that those considerations are appropriate for the sentencing judge. Nonetheless, personal circumstances that favor your client should not be ignored. Remarkably, most prosecutors are human.

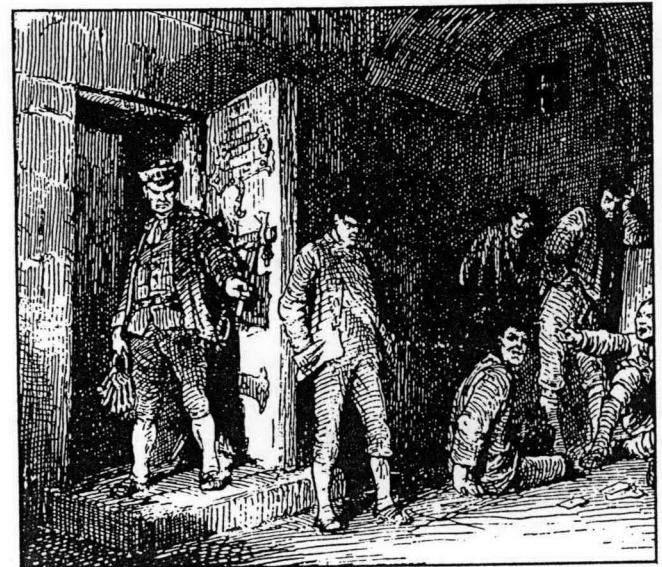
You may also be able to argue that criminal sanctions are unnecessary. Defense counsel often contend that the client has suffered enough — through restitution, loss of license or business, other professional sanctions, public opprobrium, and the like — and will not repeat the mistake. It is sometimes appropriate to suggest that criminal sanctions would be disproportionate to the alleged misconduct.

In a close case, it may be possible to convince a prosecutor that civil sanctions, such as an SEC injunction, are sufficient, and that a criminal prosecution would destroy the career of a generally upstanding citizen. Although these points are worth making, they rarely save the day.

Another common tactic is to emphasize the weaknesses in the government's case. Nobody likes to lose. More than that, with the government's scarce resources, a responsible prosecutor may agree to drop a marginal case, particularly if your client is not a bad guy or a recidivist. But to be persuasive, you must be able to point to major flaws in the government's case. Mere aspersions against the informant, for example, are unlikely to have any impact on the prosecutor unless the case is a one-on-one swearing contest and there is independent evidence to corroborate your client's version.

Also, the prosecutor may be sensitive to claims of serious government misconduct. Depending on the nature of the problem, he may choose to drop the case rather than to expose the government's dirty deeds.

After the recent arrest in New York of an assistant U.S. attor-



ney on charges of stealing drugs and money from the prosecutor's safe, the government dismissed cases that the same assistant U.S. attorney had been handling. Likewise, prosecutors occasionally abandon cases in which law enforcement agents have committed egregious Fourth or Fifth Amendment violations.

Sometimes, defense counsel try to convince the prosecutor that he lacks jurisdiction or that the incident in question is really "civil" in nature and not a crime. These arguments, bordering on the metaphysical, are most likely to be effective in technical cases involving tax, securities, or similar matters, or in any case where intent is a critical issue. Sometimes it is possible to argue that what is at issue is a controversial technique, such as a tax "straddle," the illegality of which has not been clearly established, and that the target acted on the advice of counsel or other experts.

Besides just making oral presentations, experienced defense counsel often give the prosecutor a brief presenting the applicable law and marshalling the relevant facts. Of course, a written submission has its risks. The prosecutor may go after additional proof, revise his instructions to the grand jury, or restructure the charges to get around the problems that the defendant's lawyer has raised. Still, a good brief submitted to a fair-minded prosecutor sometimes heads off the indictment. So, at least when the indictment would be devastating to the client and the prosecutor has an open mind, submitting a brief is often a good idea.

Sometimes defense lawyers go one step further: They give the prosecutor a preview of their client's case. In essence, the defense tries its case in the prosecutor's office to avoid an indictment and the publicity that comes with it.

The risks of this tactic are great. If the prosecutor is not persuaded to drop the case, the government can redirect or extend its investigation, revise the charges, pursue new leads, and prepare a response to the defense, including a rebuttal case. In short, the defense gives up the element of surprise.

Since the "testimony" of the target is ordinarily the centerpiece of this kind of presentation, this approach also locks in the defense, supplies the prosecutor with damaging admissions, and gives him a unique opportunity to prepare the most devastating cross-examination possible. No wonder many defense counsel *never* take this approach. Certainly in most cases, it is far too risky.

There are special situations, though, in which defense counsel should consider rolling the dice and bringing the client in to talk to the prosecutor. Too often, prosecutors forget that their target is a human being with feelings, hardships, and a reasonable explanation for his behavior. An effective face-to-face interview can restore the human element, which, in some cases, might tip the balance in your client's favor.

Recently, a prosecutor told me that she had decided to drop an investigation because the target turned out to be so much more impressive and credible than her informant. Although hardly commonplace, reactions like these are not unique.

In the difficult calculation of whether to expose the defense case before the indictment, a critical factor is the prosecutor. Is he fair minded? Will he listen, or is an indictment inevitable?

Have a chat with the prosecutor about the possibility of laying your cards on the table. Although few people admit to having closed minds, the nuances you pick up and the impressions you form at a face-to-face meeting are invaluable guides. A prosecutor's general reputation among defense lawyers is

another useful barometer. Let's face it: There are some law enforcement officials who probably cannot be trusted to come to a reasoned conclusion under any circumstance. In a particularly important case, you might also consider making a presentation to a panel of prosecutors.

An equally important factor is your best objective evaluation of your client and his story. Does the defense seem probable? Is there any corroboration for your client's version of what happened? Will your client be a credible witness and make a good impression? Unfortunately, some people appear to be lying even when they are telling the truth.

Give your presentation a dry run in front of a colleague who is not closely familiar with the case. If your colleague does

not believe the defendant, neither will a cynical, mistrusting prosecutor.

Some defense lawyers give their clients a lie detector test before taking them to the prosecutor's office. Although the results of these tests are usually inadmissible as evidence in court, a test administered by a reputable operator is useful for several reasons.

First, a favorable polygraph report increases the likelihood that your client will be credible and that you will have confidence in his presentation. Second, a lie detector examination is a useful form of corroboration in the prosecutor's office, even if it is not admissible in court, and a positive result may be decisive in a close case, particularly if it comes down to your client's word against that of an informant or other witness. Third, when the client has passed a reliable private examination, his lawyer should be eager to allow a government operator to conduct a second polygraph examination — something that prosecutors often request in any event.

Lie detector or no lie detector, in deciding whether to submit your client for an interview with the prosecutor, the fundamental question is whether the presentation is likely to persuade him to stop the investigation. If the government's evidence is unambiguous, not even Abraham Lincoln could talk his way out of an indictment. It makes sense to try your defense in the prosecutor's office only if the case is a close one. Also, the presentation is most likely to be effective if the case turns on your client's knowledge, intent, or some other credibility issue.

Say your client, a licensed stockbroker, is about to be indicted on insider trading charges because of his suspicious pattern of securities transactions and his close relationship with someone who had access to confidential information. If your client can credibly deny receiving confidential information and also offer another believable explanation for his investment pattern — particularly one that someone else can corroborate — the risk of bringing him in to talk to the prosecutor may well be worth taking.

Once you decide to make a presentation, you need to consider when and how to do it.

It is usually inadvisable to make a full-scale presentation to the prosecutor early in the investigation. He will ordinarily not be in a position to make a final judgment, and he will be able to steer his investigation around any obstacles you present. Later in the investigation, you can get a better read on the prosecutor's strengths, attitude, and goals, and you can better judge whether a presentation might be effective.

By delaying the presentation, you run the risk that the prosecutor will so harden his position over the course of a lengthy investigation that no presentation, however brilliant, will shake his resolve to indict. In my view, though, it is unlikely that a prosecutor would reach a different conclusion following a thorough investigation after a presentation. And you can always approach the prosecutor early on to plant seeds of doubt and to let him know that, later in the investigation, you would be willing to consider bringing your client in to discuss the case.

As usual, though, there are no absolute rules. If you believe that an investigation is really off the mark and the allegations are frivolous, you may wish to put your ace on the table early in the game. But you will rarely have that good a hand.

Before the actual presentation, establish the ground rules, put them in writing, and arrange for both lawyers and the client to sign. The prosecutor ordinarily agrees not to use anything the client says as part of his direct case. Defense counsel in turn should be prepared to let the prosecutor use the presentation for leads. The prosecutor should also be free to take notes at the meeting, but not to tape record it, mainly because recording equipment increases the tension and formality of an already stressful event.

The difficult question is whether to permit the prosecutor to use the client's statements on cross-examination or in the government's rebuttal case if the client is indicted and he testi-

fies at trial. Although this issue is worth negotiating, I would not let it become a sticking point.

Presumably, you have decided to try your case before the prosecutor only after satisfying yourself that your client is telling the truth and is not likely to change his testimony. The statements your client makes to the prosecutor will only become significant at trial if he changes his story. And, by refusing to allow his statements to be used for cross-examination, you may subliminally communicate a lack of confidence in your client's story.

In preparing the presentation, take the same pains that you would in preparing a client to testify at trial. Several preparatory sessions may be required.

Aside from thoroughly going over the facts and any docu-

ments, brief your client on the prosecutor's concerns and attitude and take him through all the tough questions that the prosecutor might ask. Make the client understand that he must be completely accurate and forthright in his answers and that, if he does not comprehend what he is being asked, he should get the investigators to repeat or explain their questions. Although repeated conferences between attorney and client during the presentation will make a bad impression, I always instruct my client to consult with me privately if he feels the need.

Get Some Feedback

In the prosecutor's office, I ask for a break whenever my client seems tired or starts to flounder. Try to get some feedback from the investigators early in the meeting. If you sense that the prosecutor and the law enforcement agents utterly disbelieve your client, cut your losses and call it a day. If the conversation has become a one-way street, do not let them exploit the opportunity for discovery they otherwise would not get.

You may want to present other evidence to the prosecutor as well. I would be inclined to bring in any powerful corroborating or exculpatory proof you have. Do not waste the prosecutor's time with character witnesses or other incidental matters. But consider whether to save one or two little surprises for the courtroom in case the presentation fails.

Occasionally, the prosecutor will encourage the target to testify before the grand jury. More often, your client will want to tell the grand jury everything in order to clear his name now.

Resist these temptations. A defendant's testimony before the grand jury is given under oath, subject to the penalties of perjury, and can be used in the government's direct case. Besides, in the federal system, counsel is not allowed into the grand jury room. Even in those states where counsel may be present during a client's testimony, the prosecutor almost always controls the proceedings. So, if the presentation in the prosecutor's office has not convinced him to drop the investigation, an appearance before the grand jury is usually a suicide mission.

If the prosecutor decides to indict despite your presentation, consider a preindictment appeal. In most jurisdictions, counsel can arrange to meet with at least a supervisory-level prosecutor, if not with the chief prosecutor. Beyond that, in certain federal cases, including tax and RICO prosecutions, you can appeal to the Department of Justice. Usually, the national office is more conservative about bringing prosecutions than are the local United States attorneys. To maintain good relations with the prosecutor handling the case, politely ask him to arrange the appeal, rather than just going above his head.

Experienced defense lawyers recognize that a preindictment appeal is rarely productive, and usually not worth pursuing. If you appeal every time a prosecutor decides to indict your client, you will quickly lose all credibility with the senior authorities. But, by picking your shots, your few most-deserving cases will get more serious attention. Investigations involving serious legal problems, circumstantial proof, or government misconduct are usually the best candidates for review. The chief prosecutor is simply too busy to review credibility determinations or other run-of-the-mill prosecutorial decisions of the staff.

And, of course, when all these strategies fail, strap your six-guns back on and get ready for the showdown at your old favorite corral — the courtroom. □

KING KONG KIBITZER SPOTTED IN WASHINGTON

Summary: **Susan Thomases** has no official title, but she most certainly has clout

"My mouth!" **Susan Thomases** exclaims, stanching one of her verbal torrents as if to marvel at the nerve of this irrepressible body part. "I have a very strong reality principle, and it's one of the things that gets my mouth in trouble and gets me in trouble -- from your perspective, gets me in trouble," she amends. "I think, of course, it's the source of my strength."

Susan Thomases' muscle and the eagerness with which she flexes it are reality principles to be ignored at one's peril in Bill Clinton's White House. Never mind that she has no official role there, no title, no desk, but works as a partner at Wilkie Farr & Gallagher, a blue-chip New York law firm.

Thomases is the Clinton administration's King Kong Kibitzer -- whose advice on everything from personnel to policy resounds like a mighty roar through the halls of the West Wing. That's a reality immediately clear to anyone who talks with Hillary Rodham Clinton.

"Susan is a vital, energetic, loving, enthusiastic person, who works hard at everything she does, cares deeply about all kinds of issues and people, and is a wonderful friend," says the first lady.

Hillary Clinton's view, in the end, may be the only one that matters. But it's far from universal among the president's loyalists who got to know Thomases during the 1992 campaign, in which she began part time as an outside adviser and ended up the full-time scheduling chief.

Indeed, Thomases' many detractors describe her, variously, as tactless, boastful, vindictive and politically inept -- and those are just some of the tamer adjectives.

- Knocking heads

Thomases is important. And in case that fact is overlooked,

she's happy to point it out. When a recent piece in the New Republic displeased her, she sent Editor Martin Peretz a letter written in her defense by a high White House official. "Dear Marty -- As promised, here's the letter from George Stephanopoulos. Susan," went the cover note.

"She's a woman who has 'made it,' and 'made it' better than almost anyone else, and yet she feels a compulsion to drop names and assert her authority, down to the point of saying, 'If you do this, I will kill you, I will ruin you,' " says an administration staffer who, like many people interviewed for this story, spoke only if promised anonymity.

"If she knocked heads, she didn't knock enough of them," says former top Bill Clinton aide Betsey Wright, one of Thomases' defenders. "If there were bruised feelings, they deserved to be bruised. . . . There was such a sexist strain in that campaign; the men in the campaign were so unbelievably rude and awful the way they treated people. But, my God, if somebody like Susan gets strained and under pressure and knocks heads, (they'll say) it's some kind of 'woman thing' -- some kind of 'temperament problem,' a 'hormones thing.' "

There was, for instance, Thomases' legendary remark to vice presidential nominee Al Gore, who had just made a scheduling suggestion about campaign bus trips during a post-convention conference call. "That's the stupidest idea I ever heard," Thomases is said by several sources to have told the senator (though Gore's chief of staff, Roy Neal, insists that Thomases merely said, "I don't think that would work").

Thomases is that rare operative who has successfully triangulated the power map -- she's known Bill longer than she has Hillary -- but mostly she's Hillary's blunt instrument of enforcement, according to White House staffers, pushing the first lady's agenda and gladly taking the heat. She is the raw expression of what is required to play in the Clintons' league -- but without the patina of folksy good humor.

"When she's determined to get something done, you can make a good living betting on the results," says James Carville, a strategist during the campaign. "For Susan and a lot of women her age" -- which is 48 -- "starting out wasn't as easy for them as it is for women now. She had to kind of fight with both hands, and her tenacity served the campaign well."

- Fast friends

Hillary Clinton says she and the president need **Susan Thomases** as they grapple with the task of running the country. "People in my position generally need good and loyal friends," the first lady

says. "We're lucky we have friends like Susan -- people we not only enjoy as friends but whose opinions we respect -- even though we don't always agree with them."

The two women met in the fall of 1974, when Thomases spent a weekend in Arkansas volunteering in Bill Clinton's unsuccessful House campaign.

She shared then-Hillary Rodham's passion for liberal politics and women's and children's rights, having helped create several child-care centers for working poor families in New York.

After the higher-ups at Wilkie Farr decided to make the obviously talented Thomases a partner, giving her the job of administering the firm, she always recommended the Rose Law Firm in Little Rock, where Hillary Clinton was a partner, for Arkansas legal work. Meanwhile, Hillary Clinton arranged for Thomases to join her on the board of the Children's Defense Fund.

Thomases broke into politics working for Sen. Eugene McCarthy, sent to the West Coast by her then-boyfriend Harold Ickes -- later an ally on the Clinton campaign -- to help organize McCarthy's Oregon primary win in 1968.

- Too many hats?

Government ethics watchdog groups have begun raising questions about Thomases' special relationship with the White House.

"I think this is pretty bad," says Charles Lewis, executive director of the nonprofit Center for Public Integrity, when asked about Thomases' White House contacts. "Because we don't know who **Susan Thomases** also works for. How many hats is she wearing? Has she recused herself from any clients?"

He suggests that Thomases disclose her client list and possibly submit to new regulations that apply to senior government officials, requiring a five-year ban on lobbying. Thomases says she sees no reason to comply with such rules, because "most of this is not going to be relevant soon. I'm essentially winding down what my responsibilities were during the transition," she goes on, noting that she talks with the president's scheduling department and confers on personnel matters. "They don't need me on most things anymore."

Thomases, whose practice centers on corporate securities law, says she provided the Clinton transition team with a partial list of her clients, based on her own judgment of their relevance, and "told them the issues I cannot deal with," to satisfy ethics requirements.

Few doubt that Thomases could have had a very senior title in the executive branch if she'd wanted one. She says she turned down an offer from White House Chief of Staff Thomas "Mac" McLarty to be his deputy.

Clinton staffers say she was a voice in the selection of Zoe Baird as attorney general and then, when that nomination went awry, pushed for Kimba Wood (who'd been a classmate of Thomases' at Connecticut College), while helping structure the White House staff, weighing in on hires, and playing a role -- "I'm just a facilitator," she says -- in personnel decisions throughout the administration.

So what does she want?

Thomases, for the moment, intends to remain a private citizen. "I don't want to work 18 hours a day," she says, adding that after a grueling six months in Little Rock, she needs to spend time with her family.

A title and well-defined responsibilities probably would be too limiting. It's better to kibitz -- potentially a bigger, more influential role with a presidential couple who often seem to turn late-night bull sessions into next-day action.

"I've told Bill and Hillary that I will help them in whatever way they want me to help," Thomases says. "Whatever they think is useful I will do. I'm crazy about these people."

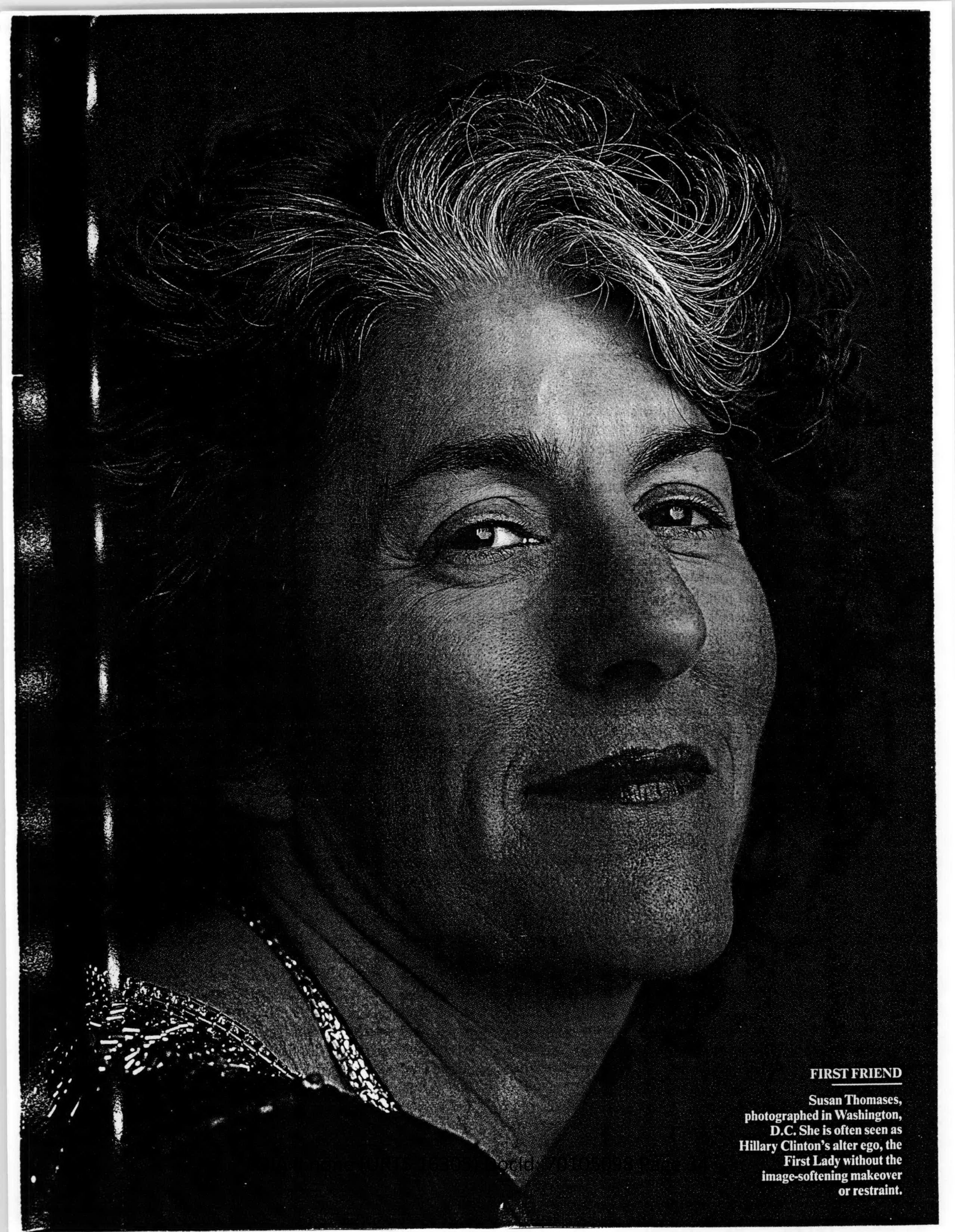
Susan Thomases, feared Friend of Hillary, has had her eye blackened by two No.1 best-sellers. Following up on the clues to her character in *Primary Colors* and to her Whitewater involvement in *Blood Sport*, JACOB WEISBERG figures out why Thomases gets voted "least popular" by Clinton insiders

DESPERATELY LEAKING SUSAN

Clinton haters and Clinton defenders alike spent the first few months of this year in rapt anticipation of James Stewart's two-year investigation into the murky doings collectively known as Whitewater. But when Stewart's book *Blood Sport* finally appeared in late March, the juiciest anecdote didn't take place in Little Rock or Washington, and it wasn't about Bill or Hillary Clinton. It was about New York City lawyer Susan Thomases, better known for being the First Lady's closest friend and most trusted adviser. Stewart related in his prologue that Thomases had telephoned him out of the blue one day to make an appointment to discuss something too sensitive for the phone. "She said a client of hers wanted a story about them," Stewart remembers. "I never dreamed

that the client might be the president or the First Lady."

At Thomases' instigation, Stewart began delving into the Whitewater story. But as he got to work, it became clear Thomases was still trying to persuade the principals to cooperate. The First Lady, hostile as ever to inquiring journalists, was disinclined to be open. In the end the administration did not assist him at all. Thus did Thomases single-handedly launch one of America's most diligent investigative reporters on a hostile takeover of the Whitewater story.

Thomases felt contrite enough about her role in the project to issue a kind of apology just before the book was published. "We all make mistakes," she told *Newsweek*. (Characteristically she later told friends that the line had been misquoted.) Thomases also denied serving as a major source for the book. However, it is apparent from context that, along with former White House counsel Bernard Nussbaum and Whitewater partners Jim and Susan McDougal, she was exactly that.

Thomases might ultimately claim vindication for her stratagem. Though it paints the Clintons as ethically lax, and disingenuous in their efforts at spin control, *Blood Sport* does not contain any grand-jury-inspiring revelations. The book's publication may mark the point at which the scandal began finally to recede. Robert L. Bartley, the editor of *The Wall Street Journal*, a paper whose editorial page has approached Whitewater with the measured temper of a rabid pit bull, has suggested Thomases should be "far from distraught."

Thomases, however, has every reason to be distraught, not so much for what the book has done to the Clintons but for the additional havoc it has wrought on her own troubled reputation. In almost every episode in which Thomases figures, Stewart provides additional evidence that her political and personal judgment is lacking. In unattributed comments clearly traceable to her, she manages to alienate the friends of the late White House deputy counsel Vince Foster, implicate the First Lady in a cover-up of the travel-office scandal, and arouse suspicions that her testimony before various investigators was the product of crafty spin control.

Others in Clinton's circle who have been drawn into the Whitewater vortex have tended to elicit sympathy from colleagues over their catastrophic legal bills, public embarrassment, and having to endure the ungrammatical abuse of Alfonse D'Amato (who at one point accused Thomases of raising the scandal's level of "incredulity"). In Thomases' case, however, expressions of sympathy have been few and far between. "Now that she's down, the pent-up hostility is coming out," says one administration official who describes himself as more sympathetic than most. "I've actually heard people say they hope she gets indicted [for perjury before the Senate Whitewater committee]. She doesn't have a big reservoir of goodwill from which to draw."

Thomases is neither the first Clinton friend to be economical with the truth nor the only one to alienate colleagues by the political equivalent of poor table manners.

She is hardly alone in her outsize ego or in her lack of a sense of humor. What is unique about Thomases, though, is her relationship with the First Lady. As principal strategist James Carville used to say during the 1992 campaign, "She has the juice," a personal relationship that permits her to phone the private quarters at midnight or show up to see the president without an appointment. This intimacy provokes a combination of jealousy, genuine concern for the Clintons' sake, and hostility, closely related to that which is directed at the First Lady.



As Thomases herself told Lloyd Grove of *The Washington Post*, "Hillary and I are a lot alike in a lot of ways." Thomases is Hillary unsheathed, the First Lady without the image-softening makeover or restraint. And it is this curious quality of being Hillary's doppelgänger that helps to explain both her unpopularity among White House insiders and the outrage she has stirred elsewhere.

Though Rodham was raised Republican and Methodist in Park Ridge, Illinois, and Thomases grew up Jewish under the influence of a Democratic mother in Engelwood, New Jersey, both families were essentially matriarchies in which the only daughters outshone their brothers (Rodham had two, Thomases three) in brains, ambition, and talent. Susan is just like her mother, says one family friend, a "baleboosteh," a Yiddish word which means just about what it sounds like in English. Family instilled in both a strong social conscience, further stimulated by the general mood of the 60s. After attending Connecticut College, Thomases helped Eugene McCarthy win the Oregon primary in 1968; Rodham, meanwhile, was denouncing the Vietnam War at Wellesley. Each also took a turn at proletarian employment: Rodham worked in a fish cannery in Alaska; Thomases reportedly drove a taxi in New York City. Hillary worked for the congressional Watergate committee, while Susan helped set up childcare centers for poor families in New York. Both, however, gravitated eventually toward Establishment careers. Rodham was the first woman partner at Little Rock's Rose Law Firm; Thomases became the administrative partner of the blue-chip New York law firm Willkie Farr & Gallagher.

It was through liberal politics that Thomases made the associations that shaped her subsequent career. During the McCarthy campaign she dated Harold Ickes, son of F.D.R.'s legendary interior secretary. He would become a key ally in the Clinton White House. (In the roman à clef *Primary Colors* the Thomases and Ickes characters are wickedly referred to as "the Progressive Labor Party's Fun Couple of 1971.") It was through Project Pursestrings, an effort to get Congress to cut off funding for the Vietnam War, that Thomases met Bill Clinton in 1970. Not until 1974, when she went to Arkansas to spend a weekend helping with Clinton's unsuccessful congressional campaign, did she meet Hillary. But the two quickly formed a powerful bond.

Thomases was actually something of a dilettante in comparison with the precocious Clintons. After college, she taught for a while and earned a graduate degree in European history at Columbia. Lacking the academic temperament, she quit and did business consulting, taking breaks to work in politics—as a scheduler for vice-presidential candidate Walter Mondale in 1976 and campaign manager for Bill Bradley's first Senate run, in 1978. She finally made it to Columbia Law School almost 10 years after graduating from college.

At Willkie Farr & Gallagher—whose Willkie was Republican presidential candidate Wendell—Thomases rose quickly, winning responsibility for managing the firm's affairs after only three years. She is said to have made a strongly unfavorable impression on those below her in power and status. "On many occasions she cracked heads," recalls one colleague. "She was not loved by the administrative and professional staff."

In 1988, Thomases married William Bettridge, a building contractor, now an artist. At 46, despite suffering for many years with multiple sclerosis, she had a child, Thomas, who is now 6. In recent years, the Clintons and the Bettridge-Thomases have often socialized together. Thomases' 50th birthday party was held at the White House, and the Clintons have visited her weekend home in Newport, Rhode Island. Chelsea stayed there when she took sailing lessons two summers ago. Bernie Nussbaum, a friend of Thomases' from the New York legal world, recalls walking into the private quarters one evening when he still worked at the White House and glimpsing a typical domestic scene. The two families were sharing a convivial dinner in the Solarium, Chelsea chatting with Susan, and Tommy asleep on the couch. As Thomases herself explained her close relationship with the Clintons to the Senate Whitewater committee, "We have stayed at each other's homes, shared family joys and sorrows."

As Clinton was contemplating a run for president in 1991, Thomases acted as a key organizer of the Friends of Bill, the overlapping circles from Georgetown, Oxford, and Yale, who encouraged him to run and laid the intellectual infrastructure for his campaign. But during the campaign Thomases failed to mesh with the younger and newer figures around the candidate. "We weren't the original group who encouraged Bill Clinton to run," notes one campaign alumnus. "We weren't part of that generation, or part of the Washington-Yale axis. Susan just viewed us as carpetbaggers." According to another war-room veteran, "It was hard for her to give up this Young Turk thing. She was never comfortable with another generation coming up under her."

A glimpse of her role during the early part of the campaign is provided by "Lucille Kauffman," the Thomases character in *Primary Colors*. The George Stephanopoulos-like narrator describes

power suits and running shoes and Gloria Steinem aviator glasses, radiating "a disconcerting sense of ownership about the campaign. She assumed herself part of the inner circle, and the Stantons [read the Clintons] never said otherwise." "A woman without intuition or antennae," Lucille spends her days trying to "coup" other people.

To a small group who were her allies from before the campaign, or who became part of her coterie, Thomases was "warm, loving, the most incredibly loyal, supportive friend you would ever want to have," according to Kathleen Ambrose, who is now deputy counsel at the Commerce De-

partment. To others, however, Thomases was closer to the description in *Primary Colors*: “an antic conspirer . . . out for blood,” or, in the unminced words of a young person who has worked with her, “an evil screaming witch.”

In the course of the campaign, her enemies came to vastly outnumber her defenders as she reportedly lobbied to have fired, among others: campaign manager David Wilhelm, pollster Stanley Greenberg, and campaign lawyer David Ifshin. Subsequently she tried to off press secretary Dee Dee Myers and adviser Rahm Emanuel. Thomases fought constantly with James Carville as well. In the midst of a squabble she would humiliate people in front of others, threatening to kill them, bury them, and make sure they never worked again.

In an incident that became legendary, Thomases tried to keep Al Gore out of the inner circle of the campaign. Around the time of the New York City convention, Gore joined a conference call about the upcoming cross-country bus tour. According to one participant, Gore suggested that the trip end in St. Louis. “Susan said, ‘That’s the stupidest fucking idea I’ve ever heard,’” the participant recalls. “There was just a total sputter. We were all sitting stunned on various telephones. It was really incredible.”

A particular source of consternation was the suspicion that she enhanced her power by bluffing. “She wouldn’t say, ‘Hillary wants this,’ but she implied it by her presence,” an official recalls. “One would assume that her authority came from Hillary, but one would be reluctant to ask.”

“She was right one out of 10 times,” says another campaign worker, “but she’d take credit for anything that went right and run from everything that went wrong.” Staffers were particularly incensed by her attempt to grab credit for the Clinton bus tour, which was conceived by David Wilhelm. That she did so while trying to get Wilhelm fired added insult to injury. “Good ideas have many parents,” says Wilhelm, with utmost graciousness. Yet when something went wrong, Thomases “would look at you blankly as if this were the first time she’d heard of it,” another staffer recalls. “‘Whose dumb idea was this?’ Four hours earlier she said it was a good idea.”

Allies and detractors alike explain these lapses in more or less the same way. “She has to feel critical,” says one friend. “She has to feel the Clintons can’t function without her.” A former campaign aide puts the same point less charitably: “People who learned to deal with Susan started sucking up to her immediately, asking her advice about everything and making her feel important. She wants to be the genius.”

Thomases fared somewhat better after the convention, a success which she and Ickes helped orchestrate. Colleagues were impressed that Thomases was willing to commit herself to an actual task—scheduling the candidate’s appearances. But she continued to infuriate co-workers, in part by refusing to abide by the usual group processes. “If a decision was made internally, it was never finally made, because she could always check one more time, run it up the flagpole with the Clintons,” a campaign official recalls. “Things we thought were killed would come back and have

a life of their own.” In particular, “it drove Carville nuts.” For instance, Carville and Wilhelm thought it had been decided near the end of the campaign not to waste valuable time in Mississippi, a sure-lose state, despite a promise that had been made to then congressman Mike Espy. According to a campaign source, Thomases appealed directly to Bill Clinton, who then went to Mississippi. But according to Kathleen Ambrose, who worked under Thomases as Clinton’s personal scheduler, such decisions were often Clinton’s own, and Thomases unfairly took the heat.

One campaign hand says he thinks the bond between Hillary and Susan was solidified during the period when the Clintons had, as it is delicately put, trouble in their marriage. “That’s when I think they became sisters-in-arms,” he says. “Susan was the one Hillary cried with, debated divorce with. I also have a feeling that at some point, when one of these bimbettes threatened to come out and expose him for what he was, Hillary dispatched Susan as the out-of-town mean lawyer to threaten to ruin her life if she even thought about going public.” This was a role she continued to play in the campaign. Nussbaum says Thomases called him in New York to discuss what could be done within legal bounds to deal with Gennifer Flowers, as well as other potential accusations in instances he declines to detail.

Hillary also turned to Susan when Whitewater threatened to break. Thomases was appointed to deal with inquiries from Jeff Gerth, the *New York Times* reporter who happened on the story. After the Flowers and draft-evasion incidents, Whitewater might have been a fatal third strike for the candidate, but as Stewart recounts in *Blood Sport*, Thomases handled Gerth effectively. She stalled and gave him just enough information to confuse the issue, while disingenuously telling him it was William Kennedy at the Rose Law Firm who wouldn’t give her the information. As Stewart writes, Thomases was delighted with the end result. The Gerth story, when it finally appeared, was in her opinion incomprehensible.

According to Elizabeth Drew’s book *On the Edge*, Thomases was interested in two positions after the election, attorney general and White House chief of staff. When it became clear that she would be chosen for neither, she settled for advising the administration on a freelance basis. For would-be appointees, she played gatekeeper. Agreeing with Hillary that the attorney general needed to be female, she pushed the ill-fated Zoe Baird nomination, and after that the equally unsuccessful choice of Kimba Wood, who had been a classmate of Thomases’ at Connecticut College. She also played a key role in selecting Nussbaum as White House counsel. But not all her choices were bad. Nussbaum points out that Thomases deserves a share of the credit for the Supreme Court selection of Ruth Bader Ginsburg, with whom she had studied at Columbia Law School.

In addition to her work in personnel, Thomases was generally unhelpful when it came to the administration’s early difficulties with media relations. “She reinforces Hillary’s worst instincts on all these (Continued on page 170)

(Continued from page 142) questions," says one Clintonite. According to Bob Woodward's book *The Agenda*, Susan and Hillary decided in the early days of the administration to move the press operation out of the White House and into the Old Executive Office Building, in order to get hated journalists farther away from the First Family. In the end, they settled for denying reporters their traditional access to the office of the communications director (then George Stephanopoulos), where they had previously gone to get the administration's reaction to breaking news. This provoked a calamitous deterioration in Stephanopoulos's relations with the press.

Staying outside the administration left Thomases free to develop her legal business, but that too became a source of grief. A *Newsweek* article by Michael Isikoff that appeared in 1995 offered a peek into Thomases' heavy-handed lobbying style during her weekly Wednesday trips to the capital. She reportedly told one client, "This matter is not going to be reviewed by the president of the United States"—implying that such a review was well within her power, if need be. Later, she had Ickes reach down the chain of command to request a status report on the case. "She's not shy about her access," says one administration official. "You'll never find her playing it down."

In line with the administration's rhetoric about restricting the activities of revolving-door lobbyists, holders of White House passes were required in 1993 to disclose their clients. The so-called "Gang of Four" top campaign advisers—James Carville, Paul Begala, Mandy Grunwald, and Stanley Greenberg—all dutifully did so. Thomases, however, gave up her pass rather than reveal the names of those she worked for. "It's outrageous," says Charles Lewis, director of the lobbying-watchdog group the Center for Public Integrity. "Lots of lobbyists with a 50th of her access are required to disclose. For her not to disclose her clients is contemptuous to say the least."

But the issue of Thomases' lobbying has been overwhelmed by a more immediate ethical question, her role in the handling of documents in the aftermath of Vince Foster's suicide. In the 48 hours following that tragic and stunning event, there was a flurry of phone calls among Thomases, Bernard Nussbaum, Hillary Clinton, and her chief of staff, Maggie Williams. At first, according to Justice Department lawyers, Nussbaum had agreed to let them perform the search,

but after the calls, he announced that he would do it himself, with the lawyers and Park Police officers watching from a distance. As a result, documents relating to Whitewater were removed from Foster's office without being seen by investigators. The manner in which the search was conducted fueled suspicions that the White House was trying to hide something, suspicions that have yet to be entirely dispelled.

Phone records obtained by the Senate Whitewater committee provided almost overwhelming circumstantial evidence that Thomases had been a crucial link in restraining the search. At 6:44 A.M. Little Rock time on the second day after the suicide, the First Lady, who was staying with her mother, received a call from Maggie Williams. They talked for seven minutes. At 6:57, Mrs. Clinton phoned Susan Thomases, and they spoke for three minutes. At 7:01, Thomases paged Bernie Nussbaum. At 7:25, she called Mrs. Clinton back. Thomases then placed a series of calls to the White House while Nussbaum and others were meeting about the search. In the midst of this volley, Nussbaum announced to the investigators that they wouldn't be allowed to look at all of Foster's papers. Steve Neuwirth of the White House counsel's office testified that Nussbaum had told him that the First Lady and Thomases didn't want the police to have "unfettered access." (Nussbaum did not recall saying this and has claimed that the decision was entirely his own.)

In a series of hearings before the committee, Thomases said she hadn't instructed anyone about the search or acted as a conduit for instructions. In three appearances, her memory of the calls grew dimmer and dimmer. When she first testified, in August, she had a detailed recollection of her conversation with Hillary Clinton after the suicide; she was certain they had not discussed the documents in Foster's office. She claimed a call to Nussbaum was merely an attempt to "reach out" to him. Nussbaum, however, remembered this conversation differently. "She said people are concerned about whether I was using the correct procedure. . . . Whether it was proper to give people access to the office at all," Nussbaum testified in a deposition. At that point, just after the suicide, the only "people" at the White House Thomases had spoken to were the president, the First Lady, and Maggie Williams.

In November, the D'Amato committee gained access to additional phone records, which showed a total of 17 calls between Thomases and various White House per-

sonnel after the suicide. She was summoned again, but her recollection was vague. She did not remember whom she spoke to when she called the White House, or even if she spoke to anyone, or what any of the conversations were about, other than her offering emotional support. "It defies credibility," D'Amato fumed. Lauch Faircloth of North Carolina was even angrier. "Ms. Thomases, I do not believe . . . that this absolute plethora of repeated telephone calls from you to Ms. Williams, to Mrs. Clinton, back and forth, were all touchy-feely, love-in-bloom, sympathetic telephone calls," he scoffed.

In her third and final appearance, in December, committee counsel Michael Chertoff grilled Thomases about another set of eyebrow-raising circumstances. On July 26, a few days after the search, Thomases received a call from Robert Barnett, one of the Clintons' personal attorneys. The next morning Hillary Clinton left a message requesting that she come that day to the White House. On the 27th, both Barnett and Thomases were at the White House—Barnett was there to pick up the box of the Clintons' personal papers that had been removed from Foster's office. Visitor logs show Thomases stayed there for six hours, including an hour and a half in the personal residence. As to what happened, Thomases' mind was an absolute blank.

CHERTOFF: What did the First Lady want to see you about?

THOMASES: I have no idea.

CHERTOFF: Did you see her?

THOMASES: I honestly do not remember seeing her. . . .

CHERTOFF: Do you remember coming to the White House?

THOMASES: No.

CHERTOFF: You come up to the second floor of the residence, remember that?

THOMASES: No. . . .

CHERTOFF: What were you doing up on the second floor for an hour and a half?

THOMASES: I don't remember. . . .

CHERTOFF: Did you see the First Lady?

THOMASES: I don't really remember seeing the First Lady that day.

The performance left D'Amato apologetic. The senator, however, seems to have missed a crucial inconsistency in Thomases' testimony, which has gone unremarked. In August, Thomases had testified, "I did not discuss my opinion—my appearance here today with Hillary Clinton." In the December hearing, however, when she was being asked again about whether she had ever discussed the handling of documents with Hillary, Thomases acknowledged that they discussed the issue in the context of her upcoming

testimony "before the first hearing." This contradiction is important because it goes to the heart of whether Thomases and the First Lady straightened out their stories about not attempting to constrain the search of Foster's office.

Thomases has seemed to contradict herself on other points as well. In *Blood Sport*, Jim Stewart describes a hitherto unknown visit Vince Foster paid Thomases shortly before his suicide. Since the only other participant in the conversation is dead, Thomases is obviously the source. According to Stewart, and hence to Thomases, Foster brought up the travel-office affair, "adding that he didn't trust David Watkins, who he feared might fabricate or embellish the facts to cover himself—possibly at the expense of the First Lady." The apparent reference here is to a memo written by Watkins about the travel-office scandal, which surfaced in late 1995, more than two years after the alleged conversation between Foster and Thomases and long after it was originally subpoenaed by congressional investigators. The document damagingly portrayed Hillary Clinton as far more involved in the travel-office firings than she has acknowledged in public statements and in a sworn deposition. As relayed by Stewart, Thomases' spontaneous recollection appears as a stunning effort at spin control: an attempt to cover for the First Lady.

But the rest of the Thomases-supplied passage disturbs those who were Foster's friends much more. "One thing he had not missed about his life in Little Rock was Lisa, his wife," Stewart continues. "The marriage had not been what he'd hoped for, and it hadn't been for years. . . . She was completely dependent on him, and this had become a burden." This was seen as a shocking act of disloyalty and disrespect to Lisa Foster. But Thomases had created an even bigger problem for herself. This story contradicts what Thomases told the F.B.I. about her lack of insight into Foster's suicide. According to F.B.I. notes, when Thomases was asked in 1994 about the Foster suicide she did not even recall such a conversation taking place. (Thomases' lawyer has said that the F.B.I.'s information is incorrect.) Realizing this only after she had spoken to Stewart, Thomases and her lawyer tried, without success, to get him to remove the passage from the book before publication. (Neither Thomases nor her lawyer returned calls for this article.) These issues may be explored if Thomases testifies again. The Whitewater committee tried to recall her earlier testimony for a fourth

time. But having slipped on the ice and broken her leg, she was granted a delay.

Susan Heilbron, a New York lawyer and close friend of Thomases', says there is a good explanation for the memory lapses: M.S., the disease from which they both suffer. "It's like a light switch," Heilbron says, describing her own difficulties remembering certain events. Though not all people with M.S. experience memory loss, Heilbron points out that when Thomases testified most recently she appeared to be suffering from a speech impairment, another symptom of M.S.-related cognitive dysfunction. Why hasn't Thomases raised this issue in her own defense? Like many highly functioning people with M.S., Heilbron says, Thomases "doesn't like to talk about her infirmity."

Dr. Nicholas La Rocca, a Westchester, New York-based M.S. specialist who knows Thomases (but has never treated her), finds this explanation plausible. "M.S. can affect memory," he says. "It is estimated that upwards of perhaps 50 percent of people who have M.S. experience cognitive dysfunction at some point during the course of illness." He says that the small part of Thomases' testimony he saw "did remind me of some of my clinical experience with M.S. in which extremely intelligent, high-functioning people have said they have extreme difficulty at times remembering entire conversations."

But even Thomases' allies don't entirely buy this interpretation. "Everybody thinks Susan lied to Congress, including all of her friends," says one administration insider. "Clearly, it's what happened. She bullied Bernie into this position on the search. He already had the worst political judgment in the last thousand years and was receptive to her bad advice. She clearly was not on the phone to weep." Says another Clinton source, "She has a great memory for details, especially when it has to do with evening up the score." But her M.S. probably means that if Senator D'Amato, or Whitewater special prosecutor Kenneth Starr, tries to bring a perjury charge against Thomases there's little chance it will stick.

There are, however, other repercussions to being viewed as a public liar. Early in the administration, Thomases' connections brought a number of new clients to Willkie Farr. More recently, lawyers at the firm indicate, she has become a liability. The bad publicity also means that her role in the Clinton re-election effort will be more sub-rosa this time. Thomases was set to run the campaign in New York with Vic-

ner will now have that position to himself.

Thomases' friends and allies argue that she has been punished according to a double standard: as a tough woman, she is a lightning rod for sexist criticism. "I never heard anyone say James Carville was too tough," says David Mixner, who raised money for Clinton and advised the campaign on gay issues. "I did not find her any tougher or any more crude or gross. I often found her more cooperative than others."

Carville, who feuded openly with Thomases in 1992, accepts this notion himself. "When women that age broke in, they had to be a little tough and brash and bitchy," he says. "She can be excessive, but she's a person who had to be aggressive. They didn't have glass ceilings back then, they had steel ceilings." Adds Carville's old partner, Paul Begala, "I think this is a sexist bias. Hillary has to be pigeonholed as a power bitch, Lady Macbeth, or the Martha Stewart mom. She's complicated, but the press doesn't want to give her that. I suspect that Susan suffers from the same problem."

But there's another kind of double standard which does more to explain Thomases. It is her own inconsistency on ethical issues. Given that she has been Hillary Clinton's sidekick in the politics of virtue, her ordinary lapses are compounded by extraordinary hypocrisy. The corollary of Hillary's secret commodities trades is Thomases' lobbying for clients and her apparent disingenuousness under oath.

To some extent the animosity directed at Thomases seems meant for the First Lady. It is probably not a coincidence that in *Primary Colors* the character modeled on Hillary Clinton is named Susan. Thomases is Rodham's proxy, and now her scapegoat, designated to absorb assorted ill will. "Susan is tremendously loyal to Mrs. Clinton," acknowledges one of Thomases' frequent antagonists. "She would walk over hot coals for her. In fact, she's doing that now."

Were Hillary beloved, such a sacrifice might be appreciated. But even inside the administration, Thomases seems to have become an outlet for the frustration that many feel but cannot demonstrate toward the First Lady.

That animosity may ultimately sever what has proved until now an amazingly durable relationship. Washington is rife with rumors that the First Lady has belatedly begun to distance herself from Thomases, who is described as deeply perturbed by the rift. Whatever her other failings, Thomases has surely been loyal to the Clintons. She always assumed her staunch support would continue to be repaid. □

Judgment on Whitewater
Is Called Into Question;
Her Tearful Defense
'Blowing Up' Appointees

WASHINGTON — No member of the Clinton inner circle has had as strange a rise and fall as New York attorney Susan Thomases.

Known as "Hillary's enforcer" because of her close friendship with Mrs. Clinton and her famously combative personal style, Ms. Thomases has been a feared and influential figure in Washington. In a fitting tribute to the apprehension her name invokes among some White House insiders, her walk to the podium at a 1993 power soiree was accompanied by the theme from the movie "Jaws."

A more-vulnerable Susan Thomases, hobbling on a cane because of a broken leg, answered questions for two hours at her New York law firm recently. Once the administrative partner of her prestigious firm, Willkie, Farr & Gallagher, Ms. Thomases is now its client, trying to fend off legal problems stemming from three rocky appearances before the Senate Whitewater committee. An unprecedented fourth summons is imminent from chairman Alfonse D'Amato, the New York Republican who has blasted her as "not credible."

"I don't think that they understand what it means for a lawyer like me to be under oath," says Ms. Thomases, her eyes filling with tears. "I am telling the truth. If they don't believe me, there's nothing more I can do."

The very source of Ms. Thomases' power is also the root of her current travails — a friendship with the first lady that has spawned everything from satire to conspiracy theories. Ms. Thomases is lampooned in the novel "Primary Colors" as a ubiquitous and annoying kibitzer, while counter-feminist Camille Paglia casts her as "Hillary's dark side, her Janus twin or alter ego, a suspicious Medusa. . . ."

She earned her fearsome reputation with stunts like threatening to have aides fired during a 1992 Clinton campaign stop if they didn't drag away a blond supporter who bore a resemblance to Gennifer Flowers. Ms. Thomases won't comment on the incident, and Mrs. Clinton was unavailable to speak about her friend.

'Old Floppy Shoes'

Publication of "Blood Sport," a new book about the Clintons and Whitewater, has stirred yet more controversy. Ms. Thomases herself initiated it and unsuccessfully pressed the Clintons to cooperate with author James B. Stewart, a former Page One editor of this newspaper. The book paints an unflattering portrait of the first couple and may create new complications for Ms. Thomases, too. Whitewater investigators wonder why its detailed account of her last meeting with the late White House deputy counsel Vincent Foster is so at odds with notes of a Federal Bureau of Investigation telephone interview of Ms. Thomases in June 1994.

Certainly, Ms. Thomases, 52 years old, doesn't fit the stereotype of a polished power broker. Her gray hair is untamed, her suits often ruffled, and she cares little for makeup. During the campaign, her casual footwear earned her the nickname "old floppy shoes" among some campaign workers. She keeps a frenetic pace despite battling multiple sclerosis, a condition she didn't tell most friends about for years. Defenders say she is as passionate about her friends and family as she is about work; she and her husband, an artist she met while he was doing construction work on one of her partner's apartments, have a six-year-old son.

Yet if Mrs. Clinton is a Rorschach test for people's feelings about strong-willed women, Ms. Thomases is primal-scream therapy. Many who have worked with her have sharply critical words. She herself joked at a roast for political consultant James Carville that more tickets would have been sold "if they said they were roasting me—at the stake."

Michael Berman, a prominent Democratic lobbyist, says she, as a woman, is unfairly skewered for hardball tactics that "if I did them nobody would give it a thought because that's the way a 300-pound man ought to operate." But more than style arouses critics; it is also her record of giving the Clintons questionable advice.

A Combustible Combination

Indeed, the humbling of this quintessential FOB (Friend of Bill) points up how friendship can cloud independent judgment. Just when the Clintons needed dispassionate advice, they often turned to Ms. Thomases, who may have put loyalty ahead of everything else. Her voyage to the top of Washington's power structure is a reminder that power without accountability can be combustible.

Politics was the original bond between Ms. Thomases and the Clintons. The daughter of a New Jersey textile executive, Ms. Thomases had taught history at her alma mater, Connecticut College, and eventually earned a law degree. She met Bill Clinton in Washington in the summer of 1970, when she was working as a consultant and involved in the antiwar effort, and he was about to start Yale Law School.

Later, she and Hillary Clinton hit it off famously, discovering a shared passion for children's issues and for food. After Mr. Clinton became governor of Arkansas, Mrs. Clinton even had the Rose Law Firm in Little Rock hire Ms. Thomases to help segregate Mrs. Clinton's pay from Rose's earnings from state clients.

In 1978, Ms. Thomases won kudos for becoming one of the nation's few women campaign managers, helping New Jersey's Bill Bradley win a Senate seat. A few years later she became the third woman elected as a partner at Willkie Farr, and was named its administrative partner, a sensitive job she held until 1991.

She was intimately involved in Mr. Clinton's decision to run for president. During the primaries, she was an unofficial trouble-shooter, often clashing with younger staffers who feared that crossing her was to risk crossing Hillary. Invoking her long friendship with the Clintons to get her way helped cement a reputation as an insensitive Bigfoot. "There are times when she can be damn brusque and she's not reluctant to use her leverage to get things done," says her friend Harold Ickes, deputy White House chief of staff, "and there's nothing wrong with that."

Mrs. Clinton turned to her after the 1992 New Hampshire primary. The New York Times was asking questions about a money-losing investment called Whitewater, and Mrs. Clinton wanted someone to track down records and handle the queries. Several aides say they were relieved to learn a lawyer—Ms. Thomases—would review this investment.

Yelling at Aides

Relief turned to anger when the story broke. Ms. Thomases thought she had persuaded the reporter to postpone publication. So when campaign staffers saw the story, they panicked. They talked to Ms. Thomases about how to handle the fallout,

but she yelled at them, implying that they were overreacting and calling them "children," say three former campaign officials.

Though she had gone through some Whitewater records and talked to the Clintons' accountant, Ms. Thomases hadn't gathered all relevant documents, say the aides, who felt unfairly blamed. Campaign aides dashed to the Rose Law Firm, where partner Webster Hubbell handed them cartons of documents containing everything from Whitewater papers to credit-card receipts. They worked through the night piecing together an estimate of how much the Clintons had invested. That night, Ms. Thomases was replaced as the campaign's Whitewater trouble-shooter.

Ms. Thomases notes she only had 10 days to deal with the situation, and many documents were unavailable. "I tried to get the facts the best I could," she says.

Despite the Whitewater imbroglio, the Clintons tapped Ms. Thomases to become the campaign's full-time scheduler. By all accounts, she had a special talent for planning events, and she took a leave of absence from Willkie Farr in the summer of 1992, moving with her family to Little Rock. She controlled the campaign's most precious commodity — the candidate's time. "She could say no, and that's one of the most important skills as scheduler," says campaign aide Nancy McFadden, now general counsel of the Department of Transportation.

At least one Thomases client benefited from this influence. During the New York primary, she and Mr. Ickes planned Mr. Clinton's tour so that he stopped at Metrotech, a Brooklyn business complex developed by Willkie Farr client Bruce Ratner. Ms. Thomases declines comment.

'Being Susaned'

In the campaign's final hours, as Mr. Clinton concluded a marathon of rallies, he playfully suggested an extra stop to a plane load of sleepless staffers, recalls Clinton friend Jim Lyons, who was there. A chorus went up from the giddy crowd: "You haven't checked with Susan!"

Ms. Thomases was well-positioned to influence the Clinton choices for key posts, especially inside the White House. She strongly backed some candidates who proved ill-suited for their jobs, such as Bernard Nussbaum for White House counsel and Mack McLarty for chief of staff. On the cabinet level, she championed Zoe Baird for attorney general.

While she didn't have actual veto power, people familiar with the events say she was instrumental in "blowing up" — to use a favorite Thomases term — some White House appointments, including that of Thomas Donilon as deputy chief of staff. (Mr. Donilon, now a senior State Department official, says he doesn't think she derailed him, and "I had a good working relationship with her.") Among Clinton aides, losing out to Ms. Thomases was known as "being Susaned."

When the Clintons moved into the White House, Ms. Thomases returned to New York with her husband and son. Still, most Wednesdays found her in Willkie

Farr's Washington office. Despite having no official portfolio, she had a special White House pass and helped design the floor plan of the first lady's offices. She roamed freely through the White House, dropping in on Mr. McLarty and Mr. Nussbaum, and offering unsought advice to other aides, who continued to wonder if she was speaking for herself or for Mrs. Clinton.

'Midnight Caller'

Her day and night calls to the White House earned her the sobriquet "the Midnight Caller." But on July 20, 1993, after putting her son to bed, it was Ms. Thomases who received a call — from Mrs. Clinton to say Mr. Foster had killed himself. Ms. Thomases says she was shattered; he had been a close friend since the 1970s. "There has not been enough understanding of how shocking this was," she says.

What happened next is the subject of intense speculation. There came a flurry of phone calls between Mrs. Clinton in Little Rock, Ms. Thomases and Mrs. Clinton's top aide, Maggie Williams. At the same time, Mr. Nussbaum wouldn't let investigators search Mr. Foster's office. Some Republicans believe he may have been acting on the advice of Ms. Thomases, a suggestion both she and Mr. Nussbaum deny. Mr. Nussbaum did testify that Ms. Thomases asked him about the search; she testified that he brought it up. She says her calls to Ms. Williams were attempts to "reach out" to a distraught friend.

Senate Republicans, including North Carolina's Lauch Faircloth, aren't buying that, and believe some calls involved worries about the office contents. Ms. Williams says the panel simply doesn't understand the close friendship between the women. "It was not uncharacteristic of Susan — the time of calls, the number of calls, just to find out how people are doing," she says. "I hear the theory of it, but the truth of it is something very different."

Meanwhile, Sen. D'Amato is furious over Ms. Thomases' claims to remember little of a belatedly disclosed visit to the White House family quarters after Mr. Foster's death. Ms. Thomases has testified she can't even recall whether she saw Mrs. Clinton that day — a day when a Clinton personal lawyer was reviewing papers from Mr. Foster's office. A committee aide says inconsistencies in Ms. Thomases' testimony are being reviewed to see whether she can be prosecuted for lying.

Memory Loss

Cognitive difficulty, including memory loss, is a little-known symptom of MS, afflicting 40% to 60% of sufferers, according to Stephen Reingold of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society. Watching Ms. Thomases testify was "terribly painful," says New York consultant Susan Heilbron, who serves with her on the board of the New York City chapter of the society and who with Ms. Thomases co-founded a

group of professional women with MS. "To not understand [Ms. Thomases' memory lapses] could be associated with a neurological disease . . . to see that Sen. D'Amato called her a liar . . . to those of us with memory problems it was particularly upsetting," she says.

Says Ms. Thomases, "I have experienced memory problems, and I have been told it is a common occurrence with MS, but I can't say my not remembering phone calls on that occasion was because of MS."

"I think you have to put this in context," she adds, "I was very, very busy" on law-firm business. "This was not the only thing on my mind. Some of these phone calls had to do with their grief. Some with my grief. I had no other agenda in these calls."

In recent days, Ms. Thomases has been hammered in public for another alleged miscalculation — encouraging Mr. Stewart to write his book. "Let's just say that this is not the book I suggested," she notes. In it, she says Mr. Foster confided marital and other troubles to her during their last visit at a Washington hotel; but she told the FBI she last saw him at a lunch "with some other people in Washington," according to an FBI document, and that she could offer "no reason or speculation as to why he may have taken his life." Her lawyer says the FBI document is incorrect.

Some former campaign colleagues were shocked to see Ms. Thomases at a recent Clinton fund-raiser in New York. Sitting in a wheelchair with her leg in a cast, she seemed anything but a formidable power broker. She no longer has a special White House pass and hasn't been in Washington much, other than for grillings by Sen. D'Amato. She remains friendly with the Clintons, but won't play a role in the re-election campaign. "The Clintons believed that I was needed [in 1992] and I was proud to be included," she says, "but I'd just as soon stay home. I will find other ways to help."



CAROLYN C. HUBER voluntarily appeared at the Office of the Independent Counsel, 1001 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Suite 490 North, Washington, D.C. 20004. She was accompanied by her attorney HENRY SCHUELKE. HUBER was advised of the identities of STEVE COLLOTON, Associate Independent Counsel, ALEX AZAR, Associate Independent Counsel, and [REDACTED] Special Agent (SA) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). HUBER voluntarily provided, in substance and in part, the following information:

She was the individual in charge of the CLINTON's move from the Arkansas Governor's mansion to the White House in 1992. HUBER took it upon herself to coordinate the move because she had been involved in every move the CLINTON's had made. She contacted Mr. YARBOROUGH at Merchants Moving Company, an affiliate of United Van Lines, for the transfer and storage of the CLINTONs personal items to Washington, D.C..

YARBOROUGH was instructed to move everything that belonged to the CLINTON's in the mansion. Sometime in November 1992, Merchants Moving Company and some volunteers started packing the CLINTON's personal items at the Governor's mansion. This process went on until January 16, 1993.

Boxes and larger items such as furniture were labeled with a color coding system to assist the movers in knowing where to place the boxes once they were at the White House. One color was for boxes and other items that were to be placed on the first or second floor of the White House. Another color was for items that were to go into a government storage facility in Maryland. Most of the CLINTON's file cabinets and personal papers went to the White House.

The attic in the Arkansas Governor's mansion was where the CLINTONs kept their personal documents. These documents were kept in two file cabinets and five boxes. There was a black metal, four drawer file cabinet which kept the CLINTONs' personal records such as Birth Certificates. There was also a short,

brown, two drawer file cabinet which held personal effects such as personal letters. The five boxes contained the CLINTONS' financial records which included tax returns and investment records.

On January 16, 1993, HUBER left Arkansas to go to Washington, D.C. with the CLINTONS. When she left, the two file cabinets along with the five boxes had been loaded upon one of the moving trucks. Merchant Moving Company sent two semi-trucks to the Governor's mansion two or three days prior to January 16. HUBER did not review any items before they were placed in the moving trucks. The movers made a log of every item that was moved. HUBER received this log in the mail after the CLINTONS had moved into the White House. She kept a copy of this log but is unsure where it is currently filed. United States Secret Service Agents (USSS) were with the trucks from when they were filled until they arrived at the White House.

Merchants Moving Company also sent a smaller moving truck to the Rose Law Firm to load several items that belonged to HILLERY CLINTON. Once these items were loaded they were taken to the Governor's mansion and placed on one of the two large semi-trucks for transport to Washington D.C.

Along with the color codes for the items being moved, boxes were individually marked as to which room they were to be placed, e.g. "CHELSEA's room", or "Third Floor".

On January 16, 1993, HUBER flew from Arkansas with the CLINTONS to Charlottesville, Virginia. From there they all took buses to Washington, D.C. The moving trucks arrived in Washington a few days before January 20, 1993. They were temporarily stored in a warehouse because they were not allowed to unpack at the White House until after the swearing in ceremony at the inauguration. The moving trucks were unloaded completely on January 20, 1993.

The five boxes containing the CLINTONS personal financial records were placed on the third floor of the White House by the movers on January 20, 1993. HUBER is not sure where exactly they were placed.

HUBER unpacked and sorted boxes on the third floor from January 20 through Saturday January 26, 1993. There were three assistants that helped her with the sorting and unpacking. They

were JENNIFER SMITH, a volunteer, VIRGINIA PENNINGTON, maid from Little Rock, and ANN McCOY, Arkansas Governor's mansion administrator. Several others assisted in unloading boxes for the next two or three months. Books were unloaded and placed on shelves, and some were sent back to storage in Maryland.

Sometime during the unpacking and sorting of the items on the third floor, the five boxes containing the CLINTON's personal financial records were located and placed in Room 323 on the third floor of the White House. HUBER left for a few days on February 1, 1993, and is not sure if the five boxes were located before she left on February 1, or after she returned. The two file cabinets were placed in Room 319A, the "Book Room".

In February 1993, an office was created for HILLARY CLINTON in Room 323 on the third floor of the White House. This office was maintained by HUBER and was where HUBER organized HILLARY CLINTON's financial documents. This office was remodeled in 1993. All of the furniture and boxes remained in Room 323 during the remodeling process.

Two Federal Express boxes arrived at the White House addressed to HILLARY CLINTON from the Rose Law Firm. They were first delivered to Mrs. ALSTON, who opened and inspected the contents of the boxes. They were then given to HUBER. The boxes contained files that related to work that HILLARY CLINTON had done with volunteer groups. One of the files related to Whitewater and was later turned over to Mrs. CLINTON's personal attorney, DAVID KENDALL.

A thin redwell file containing documents relating to Whitewater was found at one point in a brown credenza drawer located in Room 323. HUBER was shown a White House photograph of Room 323 (Bates number 470-DC-18). HUBER positively identified the brown credenza in the photograph as being the one where she found the Whitewater redwell folder. This redwell folder would have originally come out of one of the five boxes and was then placed in the brown credenza. This redwell folder was turned over to DAVID KENDALL. HUBER decided that the documents contained within the credenza needed more security so they were removed and placed in a brown file cabinet safe which was located in the "Book Room", Room 319A. HUBER had trouble operating the safe combination on the brown file cabinet safe so the documents were placed into another brown file cabinet with a key lock.

The black metal, four drawer cabinet does not currently hold any documents and only has some tools and some vacation maps. HUBER was shown a photograph of Room 319A, the "Book Room" (Bates number 470-DC-26). HUBER positively identified the black file cabinet as being in the "Book Room" on the photo. HUBER identified a large white box labeled "important papers" on the ground in the photo of Room 319A (Bates number 470-DC-26) as being filled with old photos of BILL CLINTON when he was a child. HUBER said that she obtained this box in Arkansas after the funeral for President Clinton's mother. HUBER described Room 319A as looking the same in the photo as it did back in August 1995 (Bates numbers 470-DC-24 and 470-DC-26).

The five boxes which contain the CLINTONS' financial information are currently in Room 309 on the third floor of the White House. Room 308 contains knickknacks, and 310 is a room for the maids.

HUBER has never seen a box with "VINCE FOSTER" written on it in Room 323 or 309.

The brown file cabinet that replaced the safe identified in the photo of Room 319A (Bates number 470-DC-26) currently holds the CLINTON tax returns for 1993, 1994, and 1995. It also holds some miscellaneous financial documents.

When HUBER first found the Rose Law Firm billing records, she was retrieving something out of the brown file cabinet located in Room 319A. She then saw a box of knickknacks on the table that she needed to take to her desk downstairs. She placed the billing records into the box of knickknacks and took them downstairs. Huber was unsure whether the box containing the billing records was brought down by itself or with other boxes. She emphasized that she has not thought about this since January 1996, and has not reviewed her prior statements.





On 4/3/96, ANTHONY ADKINSON, Manager, Loss Prevention Department, United Parcel Service (UPS), Louisville, Kentucky, telephone 404-828-6938, telephonically advised UPS Shipping Number NY 134-658 is assigned to the National Counsel for Jewish Women, 53 West 23RD Street, Sixth Floor, New York City, NY 10010.

ADKINSON further advised there is no way UPS can look at one of the company's billing labels and determine to whom a particular package was shipped. This label is printed by the shipper to provide UPS with the billing identity of the shipper and to identify this particular package in the shippers records.

ADKINSON explained the third line of this particular label " G ID# HC" was printed by the shipper and only has meaning to the shipper for internal control.

ADKINSON further explained that the National Counsel for Jewish Women is what UPS classifies as a "Manifest Shipper" due to the large volume of packages shipped daily.

A "Manifest Shipper" provides UPS a computer generated manifest each day listing all of the packages shipped on that day. This manifest lists the shippers control number (in this case HC), the first three digits of the addressees zip code and the total weight of the package. This is all of the information that UPS needs to bill the shipper on a weekly basis. The package being shipped will have a complete address for delivery but there is no record of any kind maintained by UPS showing this delivery address.

ADKINSON assumed the shipper would have records to identify the person or company the shipper has designated "HC" plus a complete address.

Given the discovery of the Rose billing records in the residence in August 1995 by Carolyn Huber, we have new reason to suspect that not all "Clinton personal" documents that were in Vince Foster's office on July 20, 1993, made it to Williams & Connolly on July 27, 1993.

There are two basic issues: (1) were any documents (including Clinton personal documents) removed from Foster's office prior to the Nussbaum search on July 22, 1993; and (2) were any of the Clinton personal documents that were in Foster's office during the search on July 22, 1993, not provided to Williams & Connolly on July 27, 1993.

On the latter issue, we have testimony from Tom Castleton suggesting that the First Lady may have planned to review those documents. One obvious possibility, therefore, is that the First Lady or someone else did review the Foster documents while they were in the residence from July 22, 1993, to July 27, 1993, and removed some of the documents. (That itself would not have been a crime.) Another possibility is that Maggie Williams examined and removed some of the documents in her office or the First Lady's office on July 22, 1993, after she had taken them from Foster's office and before she and Castleton had taken them to the residence.

A relevant mystery that has not really been answered satisfactorily in either the grand jury or the Senate hearings is whether Foster's "renovation" file was "returned" to Bernie Nussbaum and/or Steve Neuwirth after it apparently was taken from Foster's office by Maggie Williams on July 22, 1993. If so, that would seem to prove that someone reviewed the documents again after they had been taken from Foster's office. The testimony on the renovation file issue is confusing and/or incomplete, however. Maggie Williams has no recollection at all about it; Nussbaum is very confused and does not appear to be certain of his answers; and [redacted] appears not to have been pressed on the issue in the grand jury or the Senate.

FOIA(b)(3) - Fed. R. Crim. Pro. 6(e) - Grand Jury

The renovation file has become much more interesting to me in recent days for three reasons: (1) Steve C. correctly pointed out some troubling inconsistencies in Nussbaum's Senate testimony on the issue; (2) the discovery of the billing records with Foster's handwriting on them lends new credence to the theory that someone reviewed the Foster documents in the residence in July 1993; and (3) the interview notes provided to me by Sheila Cheston on January 19, 1996,

reveal a fair degree of interest in that file on the part of the Counsel's office. Indeed, Sheila volunteered to me that she "never really figured out the renovation file issue."

FOIA(b)(3) - Fed. R. Crim. Pro. 6(e) - Grand Jury
