- personal friends w/ VF

Foster death background

- she says she was at her mother's house when she learned of VF's death

- McLarty called (cf. Maggie Williams' testimony)

- talked to POTUS

- Maggie
- Sheila Anthony
- Lisa Foster
- Webb Hubbell

- did not ask Maggie to do anything or to go to the White House that night

(18) - no conversations w/ anyone re:

Foster documents

- no knowledge that anything was taken out of Foster's office

- Bernie showed her note on 26th

- Hillary did talk to Bernie or Maggie re: blind trust (Brant Buck)

- Brant Buck went by Hillary's mother's house

- she doesn't remember whether anyone called her about procedures for office search

- doesn't remember if she expressed concern about Park Police having access to documents

- does remember discussing it w/ Nussbaum after the fact

- w/r/t Clinton personal documents, ~~they~~ BN called Maggie + had the documents turned over - Maggie talked to Bob Barnett
- at some point Maggie called HRC and said documents were to be given to Bob Barnett
- HRC said: talk to Carolyn Huber and she may know where to put them ~~because~~ before they could get to Bob
- doesn't know whether those documents were part of review process
- "it never crossed my mind at all" that Foster might have documents in his office that might have adverse implications for HRC or POTUS
- never said anything to anyone that night about going to Foster's office + removing documents
- [Blair got involved in legal tasks while GC of Tysons Foods]

- was in residence w/ President when Bill Burton came in + said prelim report of suicide
- plan was that McLarty would take him upstairs + tell him privately
- called Carol Rashow, Podesta
- George Steph called Hubbell
- remembers talking to Watkins, who called in, and was going to go w/ USPP to Foster's residence
- when McLarty + President went upstairs, Gearan went into map room w/ Lindsey, Seidman, Dee Myers, Steph => and Bernie came in
- doesn't recall any discussion of a note => BUT IT WAS THE OBVIOUS PRESS QUESTION, HE ADMITS
- found out either that night or the next day that Bernie did a cursory search for note
- don't recall discussion of a note that evening
- had meeting on 21st to prepare for press -> Bernie, Berger, McLarty.
- remembers that trash bag had been removed + secured in Roy Neel's office

- stayed at his desk the remainder of the evening
- did not hear anything about anyone having found a note on the night of July 20
- has a vague recollection of Livingstone telling him on the morning of the 21st that earlier in the morning he had gone to Foster residence
- recalls discussing the search on the afternoon of July 21 w/ end result that Nussbaum would use his best judgment as to what the DOJ people would see and what they would not
- brief conversation w/ Nussbaum after inventory and Nussbaum said things had gone

- found out about Foster death at 6:00 AM on 7-21-93
- working w/ Hume
- arrived at White House at 8:00 AM + Langston + Hines were already talking to Nussbaum ⇒ Markland + Hume were "cut out"
- never made it beyond first floor on 7-21-93 ⇒ they waited all day w/ a Secret Service inspector, 2 other Secret Service agents + Salter + Condon
- spoke to BN in lobby at 11:00 AM → said they were there to search Foster's office - BN said they should make request through Reno
- BN told them he had asked Foster's office to be sealed
- US Park Police Major assigned to this matter was Major Holmes
- Hume had been talking to **DOJ** while they waited on 7/21
- Markland was provided no other info and left WH on 7-21-93 at 3:00 pm

7/22

- around 10:00 AM, Markland + Hume met w/ Margolis, Adams, Flynn, Imbardino, Salter, Condon
- there was a wait while there was discussion between DOJ + Nussbaum
- Salter-Sloan battle
- Markland said no one in room

objected to the procedure being followed

- Nussbaum sat at desk flanked by Newirth, Sloan, + ~~W~~
- Adams, Margolis, Markland + Salter sat left to right in front of desk

- Markland watched carefully during search; does not believe any areas were not searched; no areas outside the office were included in the search

- Nussbaum searched briefcase - Markland noted that Nussbaum "carefully looked into the briefcase" and that anything in it he would have seen; he tilted it from side to side - Nussbaum indicated that that was all there was + returned the briefcase to the side of desk

- MARKLAND FEELS IT WAS IMPOSSIBLE THAT NUSSBAUM WOULD NOT HAVE SEEN PAPER

- Park Police got nothing that day

- Markland said they knew he was agitated during the search

- ~~at least~~ 4 people, besides Nussbaum, had been in Foster office the previous day or night of the death
- Thomasson + Pond

- Markland noted that there had been a search of the trash in Foster's office, but recalled that the housekeeper had taken the trash out + it was brought back during the time of the search
- secretary interviews were ineffective → they knew what to say + what not to say
- Newirth brought Betsy Pond to Markland + told him of Foster's depression
- in sum, Markland felt stonewalled during search

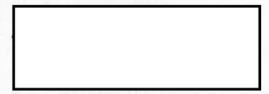

Dee Dee Myers SWORN STATEMENT 5/27/94

- was on ground floor of residence when found about death (9:00 - 9:30)
- Gearan told her in map room + was alone w/ him
- she was watching w/ Begala, Sperling, Grunwald et al.
- no discussion of anyone having found a note
- 10 - "certainly people raised the question, did he leave a note. And there was discussion about whether or not there was, in fact, a note. I never heard any discussion about the existence of any kind of note. But people were certainly interested in whether Vince had left a note."

seems honest unlike others who deny even thinking about note

- at one point Bernie said he had looked and there was no note
- recalls Gearan, Steph, McLarty, Burton, Nussbaum, Lindsay, Meyer, Seidman being in on discussion
- McLarty + President went upstairs for 15-20 minutes
- doesn't recall seeing Thomasson or Maggie Williams

- 15 * saw Bernie twice that night => saw him once before end of taping, then he went to his office, then he came back +
- Sylvia Mathews came down + asked whether anyone had taken any notes

- Sylvia recovered the trash from the maids
- ~~When~~ Bernie was worried about privileges
- talked to Livingstone a couple of times over 2-3 day period
- vaguely recalls getting chronology from CL

Stephen NEUWIRTH

5/13/94

- Nussbaum called him before midnight re: Foster's death
- arrived at work at 7:30 AM on 21st
- Betsy Pond was at desk when he arrived
- HE LOOKED BRIEFLY INTO NUSSBAUM'S OFFICE
- Nussbaum arrived later that morning
- not a part of morning meetings
- cannot recall anyone going into Foster's office after guard posted
- later ^{morning} meeting on July 21: Park Public officers briefed a number of staffers on their findings
- thinks Foster's trash was removed by someone on 7/20 and then brought back at a later time
- he was present at one mtg regarding search in McLarty's office w/ Burton, Lindsey, Nussbaum, McLarty, + Quinn
- range of methods discussed regarding means of accommodating the USPP's desire to search Foster's office => he recalls no mention of potential embarrassment or political damage
- HE RECALLS hearing from Nussbaum on either July 21 or July 22 that HRC was concerned about unfettered access to Foster's office
- talked w/ Pond, Tripp, + Gorham regarding proposed interviews of these employees - sat in on some

- during flight back, Barnett said certain documents were to be given by Williams

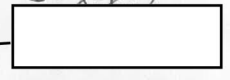

- Nussbaum does not recall anyone mentioning any kind of note but occurred to him that he should look for note
- so around 10:00 he went up to office + saw Thomasson sitting there + saw Williams on couch
- Thomasson was looking in drawers + surface look
- all 3 left together + had not found anything
- no one considered Foster's office a crime scene
- does not remember seeing Foster
- made calls
- locked suite when left
- went to Neel's office
- vague recollection of seeing Livingstone on night of 20th
- if any instructions were given to CL, it would have been Kennedy

Lisa Foster called early on 21st asking if BN had fired Foster

- lots press calls
- Betsy Pond said she had been in Foster's office + BN said to stay out
- staff meeting: talked to Sloan + Newirth about sealing the office \Rightarrow noted that it was too late actually to seal office
- guard at door + then locked w/ 2 keys: one for Secret Service and one for Nussbaum
- met in Watkins' office w/ Park Police + "took Kennedy with him" Steph + Burton were there
- got picture out of office
- BN decided to ~~call Penn or Heymann~~
- afternoon mtg w/ Margolis + Adams + Park Police - wanted to interview people regarding Foster's state of mind and look at the office to see if there was a note
- Nussbaum says no fights between the parties
- Nussbaum does not remember agreeing to show documents to individuals from DOJ - there were unclear privilege issues
- BN would do search in their presence
- discussed procedure w/ Sloan, Newirth, Burton, McLarty, Jack Quinn, + probably Lindsey
- Whitewater never came up as

③ called McLarty + Gergen

④ called Hamilton

decided not to turn it over until the next day

- Quinn met w/ Nussbaum in VP's office, next to McLarty's office w/ possibly Newirth + Burton + Lindsey

- Quinn wanted to protect the traditional presidential privilege and avoid any improper exposure of classified mater; Nussbaum said that investigators had to be there during the initial review

- about 15/20 discussion w/ others remaining quiet

- Quinn believes that Nussbaum's position evolved during the meeting to the plan in which Nussbaum would initially examine each document

- Quinn mentioned the meeting to TODD CAMPBELL, who was counsel to VP

was Quinn directed by McLarty who in turn was directed by POTUS

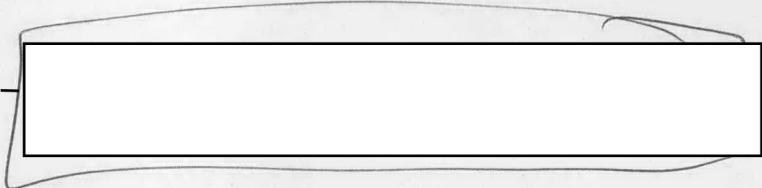

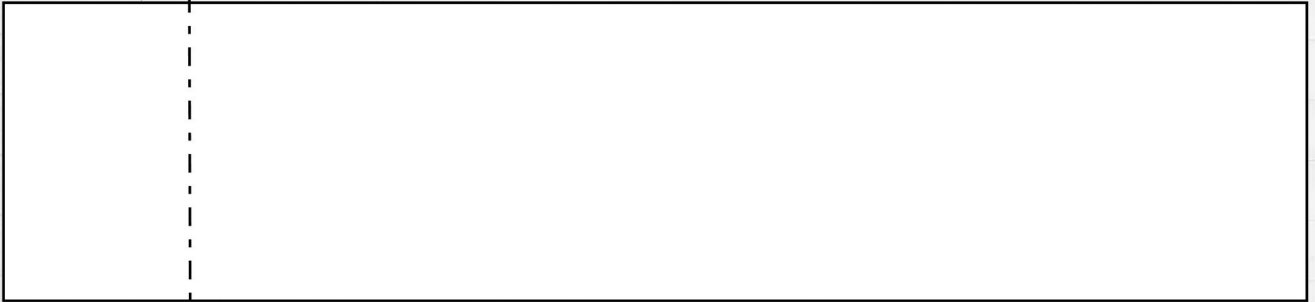

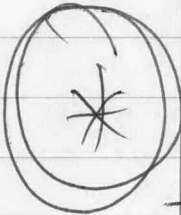

- worked the 6:30 am - 3:00 pm shift
- b/c of Foster's death, [redacted] Abbatt arrived at work w/ heightened sense of awareness
- at approximately 6:45 - 6:50 AM, shortly after he assumed his post
- saw Craig Livingstone and another man stepping from elevator ~~in~~ man w/ livingstone was carrying a cardboard box w/ top open - several dark binders were visible inside the box
- CL was carrying a dark briefcase that opens from the top
- * several things caused him to take note - livingstone was a Special Asst to Nussbaum in charge of security matters + therefore felt that the 2 men were coming from Nussbaum or perhaps Foster's 2d floor office
 - unusual for CL to be there then because his office was in OEAB
 - unusual to see livingstone only in pants + shirt
 - unusually early
- later told USSS Inspector Martin what he had seen ⇒ does not recall telling anyone else

Bruce Abbott

6/22/94

- took post on morning of July 21 w/ heightened sense of awareness
- around 7:00 AM (6:50 - 7:15 AM) he saw Craig Livingstone + another man - he knew Livingstone
- he could easily hear elevator motor running before the elevator stopped and the door opened
- b/c of length of time of elevator running, assumed it was coming from second floor
- Livingstone was carrying a briefcase that opened from top like a clam shell [did it have handles?]
- the other guy had box w/ several looseleaf binders stacked vertically on their edges
- CL was semi-casual w/ perhaps a tie; other guy was more casual
- 75-80% sure it was CL
- saw him later morning at Watkins' office dressed in same manner
- CL distinctive + reported it to Martin at around 10:00 AM
- 212 photographs identified Livingstone

Afternoon Meeting, 7/21

- Margolis, Adams, Markland, Hume, Salter, Danna, Flynn, Cloan, Newwith, Nussbaum
- purpose was to set ground rules for search → help determine if it was homicide or suicide
- procedure agreed to was that Margolis + Adams would look at each document - an "extremely clear understanding" at one point Newwith said Nussbaum would look at the documents and decide + BN said "No, no"
- guard posted, lock
- BN mentioned that he had done a quick search on 7/20/93 → indicated that other people had straightened top of desk on 7/21/93
- returned to DOJ and chatted w/ Heymann, Monaco, Rod Rosenstein regarding the procedure agreed to

7/22/93 10:00 AM

- Margolis + Adams go to BN's office, where he announces that he has changed his mind (Newirth may have been present)
- BN said he would look at documents and determine their relevancy
[NOT JUST PRIVILEGE]
- Margolis called Heymann + handed phone to Nussbaum
- at end of Nussbaum conversation, Nussbaum indicated that he would get back to Heymann \Rightarrow then, Adams + Margolis were asked to wait
- BN came down at one point and said they shouldn't leave
- delay was 2-2 1/2 hours
- Adams speculated that part of delay was consultation w/ Newirth and part w/ President and/or 1st Lady

SEARCH

- began around 2:00
- briefcase = BN pulled several documents
- BN was in total control
- computer request denied
- trash brought back in
- USPP + FBI not happy
- Salter - Sloan dispute

met w/ Callier on 7/29/93 \rightarrow Callier was concerned
